Specific conductance summary:

- 16 measurements taken
- Minimum: 620 $\mu\text{S}/\text{cm}$ on 4/10/2011
- Maximum: 1550 $\mu\text{S}/\text{cm}$ on 5/4/2012
- Mean: 898 $\mu\text{S}/\text{cm}$

Chloride (Cl⁻) summary:


- 6 samples collected
- Minimum: 52.9 mg/L on 3/26/2011
- Maximum: 160 mg/L on 2/17/2011
- Mean: 85 mg/L

EPA Acute and Chronic Standard Exceedences for Chloride¹:

The EPA acute chloride standard of 860 mg/L was not exceeded at this site in 2011² or in 2012. However, the EPA chronic chloride standard of 230 mg/L was exceeded one time in 2012:

- 242 mg/L on 5/4/2012 (calculated)³

Results Over Time³:



¹ Acute standard: The one-hour average should not exceed 860 mg/L more than once every three years. Chronic standard: The four day average should not exceed 230 mg/L more than once every three years. Source: EPA. 1988. Ambient Water Quality Criteria for Chloride. EPA 440/6-88-001.

³ Calculated chloride: When $\text{SC} > 1540 \mu\text{S}/\text{cm}$ was $\text{Cl} = 0.3441 * \text{SC} - 291$, $\text{adjR}^2 = 0.98$; when SC was $\leq 1540 \mu\text{S}/\text{cm}$ was $\text{Cl} = 1.044 * (\exp(0.001609 * \text{SC} + 3.046))$, $\text{adj R}^2 = 0.65$.
