
EPA Acute and Chronic Exceedences for Chloride¹:

The EPA acute chloride standard of 860 mg/L was not exceeded at this site in 2011 or in 2012. However, the EPA chronic chloride standard of 230 mg/L was exceeded at this site twice in 2012:

o 245 mg/L on 3/5/2012 (measured)

o 257 mg/L on 10/4/2012 (measured)

Results Over Time²:
