INTRODUCTION

Squash Lake is a 398 acre oligotrophic lake located in Oneida County. It has a maximum depth of 74 feet and a mean depth of 22 feet. Visitors have access to the lake from a public boat landing (Gudis Landing), and there is also public land (The State owns the islands) on the lake. The water clarity is considered very clear. In 2005, The Squash Lake Association was founded to protect and preserve Squash Lake's unique ecosystem. In 2009 Eurasian Water milfoil was discovered in the lake. Since then, the Association has been continuously making efforts to monitor and protect the lake from further infestation.

The Squash Lake association sponsored a AEEP grant used for the years 2013-2015. The project of this year's grant focused on AIS education, prevention, and monitoring. Project activities include:

- Conduct volunteer watercraft inspections.
- Hire an AIS Coordinator.
- Conduct CB/CW training of volunteer inspectors.
- Entry of inspection data into SWIMS.
- Conduct AIS education (i.e.: update information and signage at boat landing, presentations at lake meetings, write newsletter articles, submit news releases, update website)
- Develop a final report.

The following is a summary of these activities.

WATERCRAFT INSPECTIONS

The Squash Lake Association board of directors met on January 14th, 2015 with Bill Akan, CB/CW boat inspection Coordinator to discuss the 2015 boat inspection schedule. As in the past, the board decided to have inspections Friday afternoons from 5 pm to 7 pm and weekends from 7 am to 7 pm, starting Friday, May 1st and continuing to Sunday, September 27th. In addition to these times inspections were conducted from 7 am to 7 pm on Friday, May 22th and Monday, May 25th (Memorial Day) and Friday, September 4th and Monday, September 7th (Labor Day). Volunteers put in over 120 hours of inspections and contacted 209 people (See appendix A).

CB/CW TRAINING

It has become increasing more difficult to maintain active crews of trained volunteers. Watercraft inspectors are the first line of defense in preventing the spread of AIS and also serve an important role in educating watercraft owners on how and why it is important to inspect their equipment. The Oneida County AIS Coordinator held several CB/CW workshops around the county. Several Squash Lake members attended the workshop held at the county courthouse on April 29th, 2015. In addition, several hours of CB/CW inspection training were held at Gudis landing on Squash Lake (See Appendix A.

Since 2009, when Eurasian watermilfoil was discovered in Squash Lake, the Association has taken several steps to control EWM. These have included, manually removing EWM with divers, shoreline monitoring, sending letters to residents on the lake, articles in the newsletter and website. Special efforts by volunteer inspectors to educate the public at the landing where milfoil concentrations are found and asking they to stay away from these areas.. The overall consensus has been the association has done an excellent job of educating the public.

OTHER ACTIVITIES

The Squash Lake Association sponsored its second annual charity golf tournament at the Northwood Golf Course in Rhinelander, WI. The money that was raised will be used for CB/CW education, Eurasian Water milfoil removal, and supplies. The Squash Lake Association thanks all of the sponsors, volunteers, and golfers that participated in the event. Also a special thanks to members of the golf committee for all the time spent organizing the event. The 5th Silent Auction and flea market was held at the annual meeting on June 27th, 2015. Board member Karen Isbrandes Brown, spent 14 hours planning and presenting the fundraiser. Money from auction items and the flea market will be used to support education efforts. The Squash Lake Association expresses appreciation to all those who contributed items and to members who made purchases.

GRANT HOUR SUMMARY

Bill Akan, CB/CW Coordinator was paid a stipend by the Squash Lake Association. He was responsible for inspection training, scheduling volunteers, and data entry into SWIMS, organizing and writing the final grant report. Volunteers spent 201.5 hours on watercraft inspections at Gudis Landing. 138 boats were inspected and 322 people were contacted. These figures were entered into the SWIMS data base. 14 hours were spent on training new volunteers. 9 new inspectors were trained. 14.5 hours were spent on grant writing and meetings on CB/CW activities. 4 hours were spent on maintaining and updating the inspection schedule on the website.70 hours were spent on the newsletter keeping Association members informed about CB/CW inspections and AIS news. A total of 319 hours were spent by the Association and its members on CB/CW activities. Thanks to all the work of volunteers there were no new Invasive species at the landing during inspection hours
