#### **Regional Water Quality Plan Integration**

#### Collaboration with Other Agencies

- Continued collaboration with the Clean Lakes Alliance associated with the implementation of the *Yahara CLEAN Strategic Action Plan for Reducing Phosphorus*.
- Continued collaboration with the Madison Area Municipal Stormwater Partnership (MAMSWaP) and Green Tier Clear Waters Initiative on stormwater management and erosion control in the region.
- Expanded collaboration with the WI Salt Wise partnership on efforts to reduce salt pollution in our lakes, streams and drinking water

#### Public Information and Education

• Conducted a variety of outreach activities related to water quality planning including presentations, bi-weekly e-newsletters, website content, and social media.

#### Water Quality Plan Amendments

#### <u>Sewer Service Area Amendments</u>

- Worked with the Town of Westport on a potential sewer service area amendment proposal.
- Completed staff analysis report and held public hearing for amendment to the sewer service area boundaries in the City of Verona (Verona SSA).
- Coordination with DNR on the Water Quality Plan amendment process.

#### Water Quality Plan Consistency

#### 208 Conformance Reviews

- Reviewed 18 sewer extensions for consistency with the *Dane County Water Quality Plan* and its conditions of approval. This includes the review of stormwater management plans where required as a condition of approval.
- Responded to requests for information related to the sewer extension review and approval process.

#### Water Quality Plan Consistency Reviews

• Reviewed plats and development plans for consistency with the environmental corridors adopted in the *Dane County Water Quality Plan.*

#### Waubesa Wetlands Study Plan

• Continued to coordinate with the WDNR, U.W. Madison Water Resources Management Practicum, and other stakeholders on the development of a resource management plan for the Waubesa Wetlands Watershed.

• Responded to requests for information and investigated issues related to wetland resources protection, water quality conditions, groundwater management, stormwater management, and environmental corridors.

• Completed work on a collection system capacity evaluation for the Pleasant Springs Sanitary District.

- Continued collaboration with the Dane County Lakes & Watersheds Commission on implementation of the recommendations of the Stormwater Technical Advisory Committee.
- Continued work on identifying and mapping internally drained areas.

• Continued submittal of materials, reports, and correspondence to the WDNR Surface Water Integrated Monitoring System (SWIMS).
