SUBJECT: Potosi-Tennyson WWTF receiving water classification—side area of Mississippi River;

**Grant County** 

## Overview of issue

Potosi-Tennyson WWTF has a discharge pipe behind a jetty along the east bank of the Mississippi River in Grant Co. The facility has been receiving LAL-Wetland-based limits, though it is not specifically listed in ch. NR 104 as LAL-Wetland. In aerial photos over time (attached), the area of the discharge appears to sometimes be open water and sometimes vegetated. Camille Bruhn did a site visit on June 21, 2022 to determine whether the location should be appropriately classified as wetland (LAL) or whether it is likely to support fish and should have a full aquatic life classification. At the time of Camille's visit, the discharge pipe was in a large area of open water (see photos) and was not appropriate for a fish or habitat survey, which are not designed for these conditions.


Based review of available maps and discussion with Sally Jarosz and Liam Kolb from the DNR's wetlands program, it was determined that the area where the outfall is located is likely to have sufficient connectivity with the Mississippi main channel to support fish at least part of the time. During wet years, the area appears to have open water, and during dryer years it is likely that fish would have access at least during the spring. Therefore a fish and aquatic life use of Warmwater should apply to the area where the outfall is located to protect the fish community while present. Sally and Liam noted that the area of the outfall is not what would typically be considered a "backwater", which would be more disconnected from the main channel, like an oxbow lake.

## **Summary of recommendations**

- Segment 1: Area of outfall behind jetty on Mississippi River
  - o Codified designated use: Not listed in ch. NR 104; defaults to Warmwater
  - o Classification used for previous permit issuance: LAL-Wetland
  - o *Previous stream class recommendations:* 2003 proposal recommended listing this site as "wetland" (i.e. LAL)
  - o Modeled Natural Community: NA (Mississippi River is Warmwater)
  - o New recommended Natural Community and Designated Use: Warmwater








