Core Site Summary 2011 (Clark): Old oxbow of the Sheboygan River with a narrow loop of ditched wetlands. The outer edges of the loop are fairly steep slopes with disturbed oak forest. The inner portion has areas of alfalfa-hay fields, shrubby-grassy old fields, ditched wetlands, and disturbed oak forest. South of the railroad tracks is mostly Ag land with buildings - thickety woods, sections of a stream with cottonwood, box elder, and Ash-box elder forest. Site significance: One of the only undeveloped thracts of any size in Sheboygan. Management Considerations Buckthorn, Dame's rocket, and garlic mustard are a problem in the forests. Buckthorn is especially bad. The wetlands have areas of reed canopy grass but it hasn't completely taken over. The alfalfa-hay fields could be planted as prairie restorations.
