Make Woodman Lake No Wake



The Problem - Woodman Lake is now an electric motor only body of water. Admin Code NR 45.11(6)(e). no person may operate a motorboat of any kind in any manner except battery-powered electric motors at a slow-no-wake speed and in no case at a speed to exceed 5 miles per hour on: The waters of Woodman lake in the Woodman unit, Lower Wisconsin state riverway, sections 1 and 12, T7N, R4W, town of Woodman, Grant county. Woodman Lake is a 22-acre lake located in Grant County. It has an average maximum depth of 12 feet, with direct access to the Wisconsin River main channel. It has an established boat ramp and parking area that allows for motorboats to access the river, however it is approx. .6 tenths of a mile from ramp to river. I propose that Woodman Lake is turned into a slow, no wake body of water with no regulation on motor type. This will allow more use of the landing by more efficient access to the Woodman area of the Wisconsin River. I am asking for support in removing Wisconsin Admin NR 45.11(6)(e) and installing a Slow No Wake rule in its place. Do you support making Woodman Lake a slow no wake body of water?
