

Citizen Resolution # 570223



Multiple Preference Point Transfers (requires legislation)

The problem: At present, the transfer of preference points from one person (Transferor) to another (Transferee), the Transferor will lose all of the preference points for that species. You can only transfer all of your points to this person. There is no option to transfer only a certain amount of preference points without losing all of them.

Multiple transfers for different amounts of preference points to multiple license holders is not allowed. Example: if you had 18 preference points for bear and you wanted to transfer 2 points to this person and 6 points to that person, is not allowed.

Currently the following require Eligible Permit or Harvest Authorizations transfer types:

Bear, Spring Turkey, Upland Sturgeon Sparring, Sharp-tailed grouse, Bobcat, Fisher, wolf and Elk.

Preference point holders have paid for points and for whatever the reason have not chosen/ been able to use them. The Transferor should have the flexibility to transfer their preference points in the amount and to whom they designate without the penalty of losing them all. The Transferor should retain the balance of any remaining preference points after the transfer. This would help more Transferee(s) obtain their permits faster and enjoy the opportunities that this change would allow. Would not negatively impact harvests of a for mentioned species.

Would you support the Conservation Congress working with the state legislature to allow multiple transfers of preference points to multiple Transferee(s) designated by the Transferor? The Transferor to retain the balance of all unused points.
