Dear Butters-Fetting:

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) is currently investigating an open environmental contamination case at 1836 S. 3rd St. (BRRTS # 03-41-112118), located in the vacant lot directly north of the Butters-Fetting building (Building) on 3rd Street. According to the most recent submitted data, the vacant lot has elevated concentrations of petroleum volatile organic compounds in the soil and groundwater, including free product in two monitoring wells in close proximity to the Building (map attached). Using the data that has been submitted, the DNR believes that the groundwater contamination likely exists underneath the Building, possibly creating a concern of volatile vapors entering the Building. The Responsible Party for the site located at the vacant parcel is out of compliance and is uncooperative with our attempts to get them to conduct further investigation.

An investigation of the Building by Butters-Fetting is not required, but you may consider testing for volatile vapors if the Building is occupied. I have spoken with the DNR vapor intrusion specialist, Alyssa Sellwood, who informed me that she believed the concern to be low. However, Alyssa said that we could not rule out the possibility of vapor intrusion into the Building without current sampling data. As such, the DNR still considers vapor intrusion a possible risk. Additionally, after a conversation with the Southeast Region management team, the DNR does not have excess funds to allocate for a vapor investigation of the Building.

Environmental contamination was previously investigated (as BRRTS case # 02-41-184976) on the Butters-Fetting property at 1906 S. 3rd St. and was closed with the continuing obligation of maintaining a cap over the contaminated area. The Building is part of this cap. As such, a request must be made to the DNR for prior approval to disturb the cap before collecting sub-slab samples to investigate for possible vapor intrusion into the Building.
