Dear Ms. Chyrka:

The Department of Natural Resources (DNR) is undertaking a project to address open environmental contamination sites that have been inactive for several years. We are sending letters to those property owners to determine the status of these cases and to request additional work, if necessary.

In our review of the above referenced property, contamination was reported to the DNR on April 1, 1998, following an environmental site assessment for a proposed sale. A variety of investigation and remediation activities have occurred on-site. In 2008, the DNR received a closure request, however this request was denied because additional rounds of groundwater sampling were required to demonstrate that natural attenuation would bring the groundwater into compliance with groundwater quality standards established in Wisconsin Administrative Code chapter NR 140. The most recent communication in the case file includes a letter, dated Oct. 27, 2011, from the DNR to the property owner at the time, Mr. William Puchner with MPL Realty, requesting an update for actions taken to address the impacted groundwater. Our file contains no response to this DNR request from 2011. This issue remains open and requires action.

Milwaukee County assessment records confirm that Brew City Enterprises, LLC is the current property owner, for which you are the Registered Agent with the State of Wisconsin. Based on this information, we believe you are responsible for investigating and restoring the environment at the above site under Section 292.11, Wisconsin Statutes.

Under Section 292.11 of the Wisconsin Statutes, a person who possesses or controls a hazardous substance release (e.g., the owner of the property where a spill has occurred) is required to take actions necessary to restore the environment to the extent practicable. This letter is to notify you of your responsibility under s. 292.11, Wis. Stats., as the current owner of the property, to address contamination at the site.

Please review the information below. This letter describes your legal responsibilities and explains what you need to do to investigate and clean up the contamination.



Legal Responsibilities

Your legal responsibilities are defined both in statute and in administrative codes.

700 through NR 749 establish requirements for emergency and interim actions, public information, site investigations, design and operation of remedial action systems, and case closure. Wisconsin Administrative Code chapter NR 140 establishes groundwater standards for contaminants that reach groundwater.

Steps to Take

To ensure that your cleanup complies with Wisconsin's laws and administrative codes, you should hire a professional environmental consultant who understands what needs to be done. These are the <u>first</u> steps to take:

- 1. Within the next **30 days**, you should submit <u>written</u> verification (such as a letter from the consultant) that you have hired an environmental consultant or document that you are eligible for a lender liability exemption under s. 292.21 Wis. Stats. If you do not take action within this time frame, the Department may initiate enforcement action against you.
- Within the next 60 days, your consultant should submit a Status Update report for the site, including
 any work completed and a schedule for any remaining work. The consultant must comply with the
 requirements in the NR 700 Wis. Adm. Code rule series and should adhere to current DNR
 technical guidance documents.

Correspondence should include the "Subject" name and file reference numbers listed above.

Sites where discharges to the environment have been reported are entered into the Bureau for Remediation and Redevelopment Tracking System ("BRRTS"), a version of which appears on the Department's internet site. You may view the information related to this site at any time (http://dnr.wi.gov/topic/Brownfields/botw.html) and use the feedback system to alert us to any errors in the data.

If you want a formal written response from the Department on a specific submittal, please be aware that a review fee is required in accordance with ch. NR 749, Wis. Adm. Code. If a fee is not submitted with your reports, you should proceed under the advice of your consultant to complete the site investigation and cleanup to maintain your compliance with the spills law and chapters NR 700 through NR 749. **Do not delay the investigation of your site by waiting for an agency response.** We have provided detailed technical guidance to environmental consultants. Your consultant is expected to know our technical procedures and administrative rules and should be able to answer your questions on meeting cleanup requirements.
