The purpose of this letter is to inform the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR) of a spill and subsequent cleanup of a small quantity of solvent (glycol ether and ketone) at the Power Packer (a unit of Applied Power, Inc.) facility located 100 Hillcrest Drive, Westfield, Wisconsin. This letter was prepared by Key Environmental Services, Inc. (KEY) on behalf of Applied Power, Inc., Butler, Wisconsin.

The site is located in the southeast ¼ of the northeast ¼ of Public Survey Section 11, Township 16 North, Range 8 East, Marquette County. The site location is illustrated on Figure 1. The spill occurred inside the paint storage shed located east of the main building. The subject site layout and spill location are depicted on Figure 2 and Figure 3..

Approximately 45 gallons of solvent were released within the paint storage shed during the spill. A total of 42 gallons were recovered by Power Packer from within the building. The remaining three (3) gallons leaked from the building along the north end of the paint storage shed between the concrete floor and sheet metal siding. Approximately one (1) cubic yard of impacted soil was hand dug and stockpiled on a plastic tarp near the paint storage shed and covered with plastic. The soils encountered in the spill location were mostly medium to coarse grained sands. The excavation extended approximately nine feet from west to east along the north end of the shed and was approximately 2 feet wide. The maximum depth of the excavation was approximately two (2) feet below ground surface (bgs). The final extent of the excavation and location of stockpiled soils are depicted on Figure 3.

On July 15, 1997, KEY collected two (2) soil samples (CS-1 and CS-2) from the soils left in place directly below the spill location using a hand shovel. The locations of the soil samples are illustrated on Figure 3. A portion of each soil sample was field screened using a photoionization detector (PID). The remaining portion of the soil samples were submitted to Nova Environmental Laboratory (NOVA) for analysis of volatile organic compounds (VOCs) (modified 8260 and 8270S). VOCs were not detected above laboratory detection limits in either CS-1 or CS-2. The NOVA laboratory report and chain of custody are attached. Based on the laboratory results, it was determined that impacted soils had effectively been removed from the spill location.

The stockpiled soils were placed in three (3) WDOT drums by Power Packer employees. Valley Trail Recycling and Disposal Facility (A Waste Management Company) located in Berlin, Wisconsin collected a soil sample from the drums and submitted to MVTL Laboratories (Oak Creek, Wisconsin) for TCLP volatiles extraction analysis (methyl ethyl ketone (MEK) only) to determine landfill eligibility of the contaminated soil. The results of soil sampling indicated 10 mg/l MEK and permission for landfill of the impacted soils at Valley Trail was granted on August 21, 1997. The three (3) drums of impacted soil were transported to Valley Trail for disposal on August 28, 1997. The Special Waste Management Decision and MVTL laboratory report and chain of custody are attached.

The spill response action is complete and no further action is recommended or considered necessary. Therefore, WDNR closure is requested for the site, on behalf of Power Packer. If you have any questions regarding this letter report, please do not hesitate to call.
