John, Kristin, and Don,

On Friday April 7 the treated soil was hauled to the landfill for disposal. A total of 329 tons was landfilled.

The 30 CY steel drop boxes were entirely emptied on April 7, and some of the boxes were removed on April 7. Additional boxes were removed on April 10 (today), and I believe all the steel storage boxes have been removed from the site. I am glad I no longer need to dream up ways to thaw 30 CY bricks of frozen soil...

The final surface cover can now be placed by Legacy construction, and we can obtain the first round of post-excavation groundwater monitoring from the site wells. We plan to sample in April from all of the monitoring wells, and will then identify targeted monitoring wells to sample over time in subsequent sample events.

While not easy, we removed significantly more contaminant mass from this site than anticipated. We overcame abundant concrete footings, soil that was reluctant to meet clean-up objectives during chemical treatment, and even suspected historic burial grounds.

After I get the first round of post-excavation groundwater chemistry results, I will be putting together a remedial action documentation report that presents the completed actions, and documents the remaining site conditions.
