Dear Mr. Butz:

On March 5th, 2020, the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) received the *PFAS Site Investigation Work Plan* for the Bay Towel – Solvent Investigation site in Green Bay, Wisconsin. A site investigation work plan review fee of \$700 was submitted with this work plan. This work plan was submitted based on a January 2, 2020 DNR letter requiring PFAS investigation due to historic dry-cleaning and fabricare activities. The DNR letter requested additional evaluation of site operations and use of PFAS compounds and creation of a PFAS groundwater sampling plan.

Items proposed in this work plan include:

- A review of historical records to determine if areas of the facility other than those associated with dry-cleaning and fabricare activities require PFAS investigation.
- Perform groundwater sampling for PFAS at three of the existing groundwater monitoring wells.
 - Groundwater sample locations are SMW-1, MW-2R, and MW-3R.
 - Groundwater samples will be submitted to Pace Analytical for laboratory analysis of the Wisconsin 36 PFAS list using Modified Method 537.
- Sampling will be conducted with procedures to prevent sample contamination by PFAS compounds originating from sampling equipment or sampling personnel.
- Site investigation activities will be initiated within 60 days after DNR approval of work plan unless site conditions prevent on-site sample collection.
- Laboratory sample results for PFAS will be provided to the DNR within 10 business days of receipt per Wis. Adm. Code § NR 716.14(2).
- A report summarizing the conclusions and recommendations from PFAS sampling and historical review will be submitted within 60 days of receipt of data.

- DNR recommends that a lab audited for the [WI PFAS Method Suitability](#) document be used. Level 4 data package may be requested in the future to adequately review sampling results.
