AFFIDAVIT

STATE OF WISCONSIN COUNTY OF EAU CLAIRE

Wendy Didier Anderson, being first duly sworn, states that:

- 1. She is an engineer employed by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources at its West Central Regional Headquarters in Eau Claire, Wisconsin.
- 2. She has personal knowledge of the facts herein set forth and believes the same to be true.
- 3. Analytical results from a tank closure site assessment have been submitted to the Department of Natural Resources which indicate that gasoline was discharged to the environment on a portion of the above-described properties, which were occupied by Hoffman's Mobil, located at 646 Front Street, in the Village of Cashton, Monroe County, Wisconsin. The analytical report indicates that there is petroleum-contaminated soil on the above-described properties, and it is possible that there may be groundwater contamination as well.
- The Department of Natural Resources believes that removal or treatment of the 4. contaminated soil and groundwater monitoring to determine the extent of groundwater contamination from the gasoline discharge (and perhaps groundwater treatment) are required on the above-described properties under section 292.11(3), Wisconsin Statutes.
- Phil MIsna is the current owner of the above-described properties. 5.
- 6. On May 21, 1996, the Department of Natural Resources sent a certified letter to Phil MIsna advising him of his responsibility to investigate the gasoline contamination and to restore the environment. No response was received.



- 7. On June 5, 1998, the Department of Natural Resources sent a letter to Phil Mlsna requesting an update on the status of his clean-up project. Mr. Mlsna responded that the tanks, lines and pumps were removed, the remaining hole was filled with screenings and topsoil was spread and the area was seeded.
- 8. On June 19, 1998, the Department of Natural Resources sent a certified letter to Phil Mlsna informing him of an enforcement conference to be held at the Department's Eau Claire Office. The letter stated that failure to attend the meeting or respond within 30 days would result in the filing of a deed affidavit, by the Department, which gives notice of the contamination. Mr. Mlsna called and said he would not be attending the enforcement conference.
- 9. On July 2, 1998, the Department sent a certified letter to Phil Mlsna advising that the Department would record an affidavit at the county register of deeds office, giving notice of the petroleum contamination on the above-described properties.
- 10. Because the Department of Natural Resources believes that petroleum contamination currently found on the above-described properties will continue to discharge into the environment, subsequent purchasers of the properties could be held responsible for investigation and clean-up costs under section 292.11(3), Wisconsin Statutes.
