These sites were only inventoried if qty of petroleum was greater than 200 gallons. The spills list was the main source of information for determining which sites need to be investigated. The next step was to find the hard copy of the incident (spill report-local copy). In this instance it appears that the local copy could not be found.

This spill was added to the spills list from Madison information and the next step would be to check the Madison spill files. Do you still have access to spills lists? Does the spills list have a entry for this site?

At 11:00 a.m. today I received a call on this site from Brian Denston of Superior Water Light & Power. He stated that he is unaware of anything ever occurring. The file does not indicate a location for the spill, in fact the only thing that is present is a incomplete tracking sheet without location, a scoring sheet completed by John Prohaska (score = 44.5), and an unsigned note indicating that the author could not find the spill report. John Prohaska, do you know anything about this?

The date that this was reported there was a spill of 1 pint of oil to Superior Bay, at Barkers Island, no name attached and the case was NFA. I can't tell from the available information if this is related to the MGP site near the City's WWTP.

John Robinson, what follow-up would you like to see on these types of cases.
