Dear Mr. Nessman :

The department has reviewed your request for approval of disposal of drill cuttings in a Subtitle D landfill under the "Contained-In Determination" policy. In that proposal, a residual contaminant level for human health for tetrachloroethylene (PCE) was determined to be 33 parts per million (ppm). Based on this number, any soils contaminated with PCE at a concentration less than 33 ppm and passing the TCLP for PCE, are exempted as listed hazardous waste for **the purpose of disposal only**, and therefore, may be disposed of at a Subtitle D landfill in Wisconsin.

Please note, that soils having concentrations greater than 33 ppm PCE or those soils that have failed TCLP. And as you have stated, if these soils are discovered must be disposed of at a Subtitle C landfill.

The RCL developed for PCE at this site is for the purpose of disposing of soils only, and can not be applied as an RCL for groundwater protection. If you have any questions regarding this letter, you may contact me at the above address or at (414) 263-8589.
