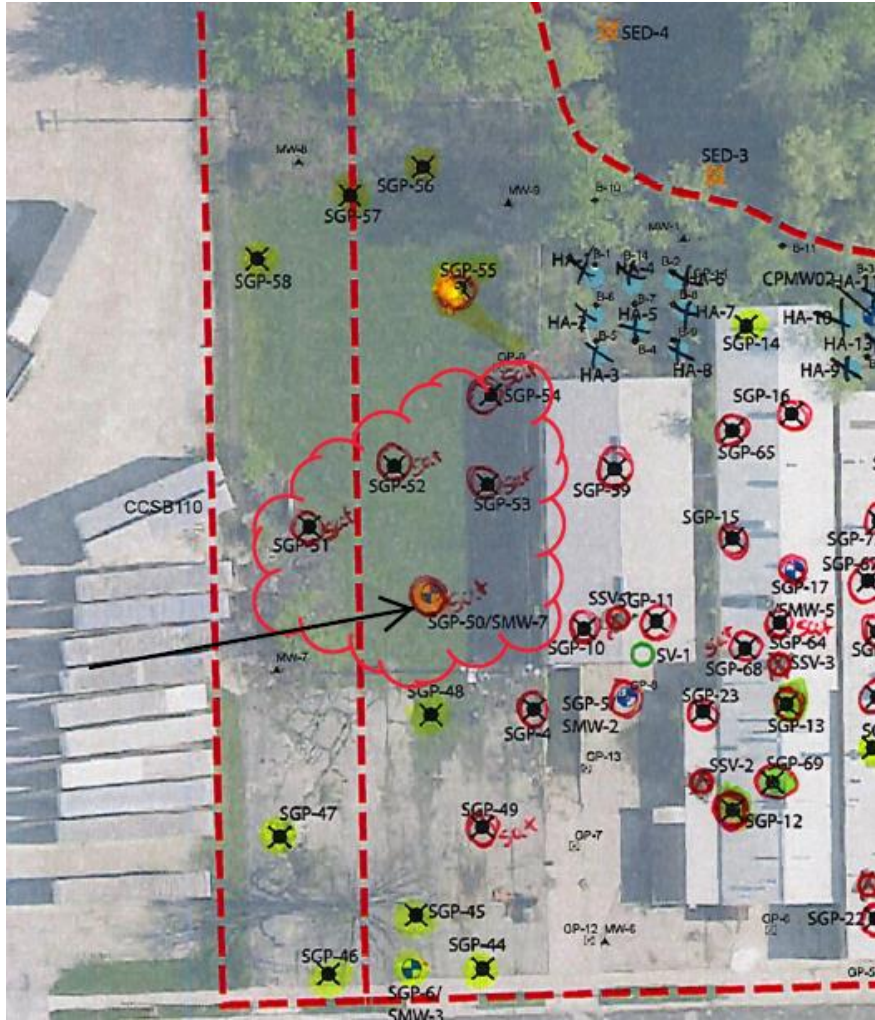

Hi Chris,

Thank you for the figure and description for the aggregate storage. I'd recommend trying to keep the aggregate storage on the former foundation (an impermeable surface) as much as possible since there is shallow soil contamination, specifically a direct contact exceedance at SGP-50/SMW-7 (indicated with the arrow in figure below). This direct contact exceedance was detected in the 0-2 feet. My concern is if the aggregate is placed in this location, if any soil is scraped up when the aggregate is removed to be used in the road, then there is a potential for cross-contamination and would then have contamination brought off-site into the roadway. Limiting the storage and activities to the impermeable surface areas will help reduce the risk for cross-contamination.

I would also recommend marking or flagging the monitoring wells to make them more visible for any machine operator that will be at the site. As a reminder, if any monitoring wells are lost or damaged during the aggregate storage activities, the wells would need to be replaced and/or reinstalled.

Attached is a map of the former Chilton Plating Site in Chilton. As discussed on the phone today, the City would like to utilize a portion of that property to facilitate recycling of the roadway for the upcoming street reconstruction project occurring in that area. The area to be used for discarded concrete and asphalt storage is outlined in red. The piles would then be recycled on site (crushed) and used for road base on the project. Also, as discussed, the City would require the contractor to line the area with silt sock to minimize runoff of dust and debris from the recycling process.

No existing soil or concrete are to leave the property. The City will monitor the operations to ensure none of the contaminated soil or building foundations are disturbed, or leave the site. Also, a provision will be made to not damage the existing monitoring wells which are in place on parts of the property.

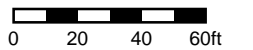
