This Memorandum addresses the single, on-line public comment that the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) received during the 30-day public comment period for EPA's proposed direct final deletion of the Scrap Processing Co., Inc. Superfund Site (Site) in Medford, Wisconsin, from the National Priorities List (see attachment).

EPA published the proposed Site deletion with a request for public comment in the *Federal Register* on July 27, 2020 (85 FR 45157). EPA concurrently issued a press release announcing the proposed partial Site deletion and a 30-day public comment period on July 27, 2020 and placed an advertisement of the proposed Site deletion and 30-day public comment period in a local newspaper, the Medford *Star News*, on July 30, 2020.

EPA received only one comment during the comment period. Upon review of the comment, and in consultation with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, EPA finds that the comment is not related to the rule-making nor is it Site-specific or adverse to the proposed deletion. Therefore, EPA Region 5 is proceeding with the deletion of the Site.
