Hi Warren,

Since you have been heavily involved with sampling/groundwater monitoring at the Aniwa Arsenic Site, I have attached the Case Closure Denial Letter for the above referenced site for your records.

To address the indication of an additional arsenic source and residual contaminated soil at the site, Mr. Lex from the Town of Aniwa has agreed to EPA assistance. On September 11, 2014, the request for EPA assistance was approved. The additional requirements needed for case closure, such as groundwater monitoring, are on hold until after the EPA remedial action is complete. Kathy Halbur from EPA and I are scheduled for September 23, 2014 to conduct a site assessment, using a field x-ray fluorescence (XRF) soil analyzer, to confirm the areas of arsenic and lead contamination in the soil that have been previously sampled. Hi Andy,

Below is a summary of what has recently occurred at the Aniwa Arsenic Site:

- September 2, 2014: Meeting with DNR, EPA, Dan Lex Aniwa Town Chairman, and REI Andy Delforge. DNR and EPA went out to the site to assess the site health/safety concerns in regards to the contamination. It was determined the site was unsecure and there was evidence of regular recreational use of the property by trespassers (walking trail). EPA and DNR then met with Mr. Lex and Mr. Delforge. Mr. Lex explained that the contamination at the site is beyond the Town's resources and concurred with the request for EPA Removals Assistance. Mr. Lex also signed an EPA Access Agreement during the meeting.
- September 10, 2014: DNR submits official request to EPA for EPA Removals Assistance for the site
- September 11, 2014: EPA approves DNR's request and assigns EPA On-Scene Coordinator Kathy Halbur to conduct a removal assessment and removal action, as appropriate. Kathy Halbur's contact information: phone # 920-662-5424 and email halbur.kathy@epa.gov.
- September 17, 2014: DNR issued a Case Closure Denial Letter to the Town, which outlines the additional requirements that must be met to obtain final closure.
- September 23, 2014: DNR, EPA, Shawano County Health Department, and State of Wisconsin Health Department met at the site to discuss the site health/safety concerns and EPA conducted a site assessment to independently confirm the arsenic and lead contamination. An x-ray fluorescence (XRF) field monitor to detect metals was used to confirm arsenic and lead concentrations in the surficial soil.
- Currently, EPA is in the process of pursuing to do the cleanup/removal action (Scope of Work preparation, formal paperwork, etc.)

Also, Kathy Halbur said, if the Town is interested, she can attend a future Town Meeting to explain the EPA Removals Process.

How often does the Town have meetings? Please let me know when you have a chance.
