#### SITE HISTORY

- Larry Schaffer

On April 29, 1991, Area Waste Water/Water Supply Engineer Steve Thon collected water supply samples at the Village of Boyd's municipal well #3. The Village of Boyd, in Chippewa County, had two municipal wells at that time. The results of analytical results from the 4/29/91 sampling indicated an NR 140 enforcement standard exceedance for atrazine at a concentration of 3.9 ug/L and the presence of deethylatrazine at a concentration of 1.0 ug/L. The NR 140 enforcement standard at that time was 3.5 ug/L for atrazine specifically. Boyd municipal well #3 was taken off-line at that time and current Village plans would permanently dismantle this well. Funding has been approved through the Farmers Home Administration to replace this municipal well in 1993.

During the course of 1992, samples were collected and analyzed at the two (2) municipal wells and private wells within 1200 feet of municipal well #3. Sample results continue to indicate the presence of atrazine + metabolites in several private wells, three (3) LUST monitoring wells to the west of municipal well #3 and in municipal well #3 at concentrations ranging from 3.5 to 16.2 ug/L.

An RP search and investigation has been ongoing since October of 1991. There are five suspected potential sources of the atrazine contamination in the area. They are as follows:

- 1. <u>L&M Agri:</u> This is a pesticide and fertilizer mixing and loading facility approximately 900 feet north of municipal well #3. L&M Agri. was sent an RP letter on January 10, 1992. They hired a consultant, Cedar Corp. of Menomonie, and have conducted a soil investigation in which only low levels of soil contamination were detected. They have been unwilling or financially unable to install the monitoring wells, which I requested in a letter dated October 8, 1992.
- 2. River Country Coop: This is a feed and agricultural chemical supply cooperative, located approximately 1600 feet west of municipal well #3, which had historically mixed and loaded on-site through the early 1980's. L&M Agri. had also mixed and loaded at this site until 1989. No RP action has been taken at this facility.



- 3. River Country Coop LUST site: This is a former petroleum service station which is located approximately 300 feet west of municipal well #3. Interviews with area residents indicate that mixing and loading was conducted on this property intermittently through 1989. No pesticide related RP action has been taken at this facility.
- 4. <u>Wisconsin Central Limited Railroad (formerly Soo Line)</u>: This railroad operates an active right-of-way, with tracks running east/west through Boyd and approximately 75 feet south of municipal well #3. They annually apply a pesticide tank mix of 6 lbs. of atrazine, 2 lbs. of 2,4-D and 6 lbs. of Karmex/acre to an area of eight feet in both directions of the center of the track. No RP action has been taken with this company.
- 5. Due to Boyd's geographical location in the center of a large agricultural watershed, there is some potential that the atrazine contamination of area wells may be field application related. It is, however, unlikely.

#### SITE RANKING & PRIORITY

The site ERRP pre-score is 28.6, which is not extremely high. However, due to the limitations of any environmental ranking system, the Western District feels that this case is a high priority because it has impacted a municipal well. Municipal well #3 will be used if the Village's alternate well should fail. It is also likely that an RP will be identified through the proposed EF investigation. The potential of cost recovery is unknown at this time.

### PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The objective of this project would be to identify an RP and also in doing so, determine that the location of the proposed new municipal well is not vulnerable to existing pesticide contamination. The area is representative of a very complex geologic and hydrogeologic setting. The scope of work would be limited to the installation of five (5) groundwater monitoring wells, two (2) piezometers, one (1) round of triazine sampling and two (2) rounds of GC analytical work for pesticides. Soil borings, soil samples (for soil classification) and monitoring wells will be installed in accordance with NR 141 requirements.

Due to the fact that the placement of the new municipal well is pending, it would be preferable if we could begin the installation of monitoring wells as soon as possible. We have determined the locations of the proposed monitoring wells in case this request for EF funds is approved. A reasonable start date would be within 45 days of project acceptance. I will assume the Project Manager role for this project and, unless a specific ERR time code is assigned to this site, code hours to SW200 and WS400, where applicable.

## PUBLIC INFORMATION & PARTICIPATION

No Public Information work has been done at this time, but current guidelines for this will be adhered to by District staff. It is proposed that, upon approval of funding for this project, we will issue a news release and prepare a fact sheet to inform the general public of the nature of the problem, and scope and goals of the current investigation. The fact sheet will be sent to township and village elected officials, the Chippewa County Health Department, and appropriate state representatives and senators. Additional copies would be available and displayed at township and village governmental buildings.

Following the review of results attained during the investigation, an investigative summary will be prepared and submitted in the same manner as presented above. The Department will remain responsive to other informational needs requested by local media and governmental officials.

#### COST ESTIMATE

I have received confirmation from Gary LeMasters of DATCP, that DATCP will analyze and fund one round (ll samples) of GC analysis for pesticides at their lab. I have included a copy of Gary's confirmation letter.



Dear Ms. Meyer:

I would like to take this opportunity to review some of the information and provide recommendations concerning the contamination of municipal well #3 with herbicides, primarily Atrazine.

In April, 1991, a random sampling of public water supplies detected the presence of Atrazine in the city well. The presence was immediately confirmed by an additional sample. Subsequent samples have found a continued presence. The levels have ranged from 0.7 ppb to 16.0 ppb. The State of Wisconsin Health Advisory Limit for this chemical is 3.0 ppb. The Village is in violation of this limit.

Immediately upon detection of this chemical the well was removed from service and remains off line. The Village issued a public notice to the water users in June 1991 as required by the Department (copy enclosed).

The Village is currently operating the system on one well. This potentially leaves the Village with an acute shortage of a sufficient quantity of water in times of extreme use, such as fire or during periods of mechanical breakdown.

It is the Department's recommendation that all municipal systems have a minimum of 2 wells in order to assure an adequate supply at all times. I will expect the Village to make every effort to replace this well at the first reasonable opportunity.

# PUBLIC NOTICE FOR HEALTH ADVISORY BOYD PUBLIC UTILITY CUSTOMERS

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources requires that we publish this notice to inform you of a violation of the health advisory level for Atrazine in the Boyd water system. The State health advisory level for Atrazine is set at 3.0 parts per billion to reduce risks associated with health effects.

This chemical has been shown to affect offspring of rats and the heart of dogs. The EPA sets drinking water standards and has determined that Atrazine is a health concern at certain levels of exposure. This organic chemical is a herbicide, when soil and climatic conditions are favorable, it may get into drinking water by runoff into surface water or by leaching into ground water. All consumers are affected equally by the contaminate.

The well has been taken out of service and there is no need to seek an alternate water supply. This action taken by the water utility is sufficient to protect water users and an investigation into a replacement well is being started.

Re: Atrazine Contamination - Boyd Waterworks

The results of a recent sample taken by Steve Thon of our Department from municipal well No. 3 indicates that Wisconsin's Health Advisory level has been exceeded for Atrazine. This standard is 3.0 parts per billion (ppb), and the sample collected by Steve Thon on April 29, 1991, had a concentration of 3.9 ppb Atrazine.

Atrazine is a corn herbicide commonly used throughout Wisconsin. It is suspected to be a human carcinogen. The Wisconsin Department of Health and Social Services and this agency have identified a concentration of 3.0 ppb as a level above which some sort of action be taken to resolve the problem.

While the short-term risk for the concentration found in your well is low, the presence of any such compound in the drinking water is cause for concern. In response to the contamination, the Department requests the following actions:

- The well must be removed from service. It is my understanding that the Village of Boyd has already taken this step. The only exception would be a fire emergency or should you lose service of your other well for some reason. The Department must be notified within 24 hours when these emergencies occur.
- 2. The village should pursue a long-term solution, such as drilling a new municipal well. The Department recommends that sampling of well No. 3 be done on a quarterly basis to monitor any changes in the concentration of atrazine.

- 3. The Department requests that the village provide a public notice in the local newspaper as soon as possible, but no later than 14 days from the date of this letter. The notice shall provide the following information:
  - a. Clear and understandable explanation of the exceedance of the health advisory.
  - b. The population put at risk because of the exceedance.
  - c: Actions the village has or will take to address the problem.
  - d. Inclusion of the health effects of atrazine (information enclosed).
  - e. The name and telephone number of the operator or designee of the water system as a source of additional information.
  - f. The notice must be conspicuous and must not contain unduly technical language or small print.

A sample notice is enclosed to assist you in formulating your public notice. Please provide this office with a copy of the notice.

Please advise me by July 15, 1991, as to what action you will be taking to address this problem. If you have any questions regarding this letter, please contact me at 839-3745 or Steve Thon at 839-3776.

BOYD -- A water sample analysis, completed May 22 at the State Lab of Hygiene, has confirmed that the atrazine level in a Village of Boyd well exceeds the health advisory level established by the State Division of Health.

The Village of Boyd Well No. 3 was shut down in late April after random testing of public water supplies detected the presence of atrazine, a commonly used herbicide and remains shut down. The Village of Boyd's Well No. 4, which has been tested and is free of contamination, has been supplying water for the community and no shortage of water is anticipated.

The health advisory levels are established to provide protection from threats due to long-term consumption of contaminated water. The atrazine level found was 3.9 parts per billion which exceeds health advisory level of 3.0 parts per billion.

Department of Natural Resources Environmental Engineer Steve Thon said follow-up sampling of Well No. 3 will be done to determine if contaminants remain above health advisory levels.

The Department of Natural Resources will attempt to seek out potentially responsible parties who would be responsible for thorough investigations of groundwater contamination. The Department of Agriculture Trade and Consumer Protection is responsible for regulating pesticide use and may assist in investigations.
