I finally got the chance to talk to Roxanne about this and DNR doesn't plan on sampling any more wells, especially this one since additional money would have to be spent on a contractor to get the well sampled and there is no one living there drinking the water.

If the property owner wishes to sample the well before he abandons it, that is up to him. His property is currently within the special well casing depth area so if a new well is installed there in the future, the well installer will have to follow the additional requirements for well installation.

Mr. Fisher also indicates that he is closing out the property and may fill and seal the well... asked for advice.

FYI - If DNR were to sample this well, a contractor would be needed to hook up generator and pump, purge the well for several hours and then collect the sample. Please let me know what you think.
