Tauren,

To clarify, not all of the properties within the Viebahn Street and CTH CR extension area have been hooked up to the City's water main. Only those properties with wells that had VOC ES exceedances have been/will be connected to City water. Many properties still retain their wells because they have no VOC impacts or the impacts are below standards (i.e. typically below the PAL).

Only one property, where we've provided City water, has retained the former potable well for monitoring. The address is 4141 Viebahn Street/2717 CTH CR – it's a corner property that we refer to by both addresses. This well is being tracked by the R&R program as it is part of our semi-annual monitoring under our currently WDNR approved 5-year monitoring work plan. The plumbing associated with this well was disconnected, by a licensed plumber, from the plumbing that serves the fixtures served by the municipal water.

All other properties where we've provided City water have properly abandoned and documented potable wells.

Tauren,

I recently completed an inspection of the Manitowoc water system. One of the requirements for water systems is to permit all private wells within their service area. I questioned Manitowoc staff about those

in the area of the water system that lie outside of the City limits and they mentioned that there are some private wells that have not been abandoned because the DNR is requiring them to stay as monitoring wells. I told Manitowoc that private wells used for contaminant monitoring at RR sites do not need to be permitted if they are tracked by another DNR program, as long as the private wells are disconnected from the plumbing that serves the fixtures served by the municipal water.

I'm out of the office this week, but working remotely as I'm able. Please confirm this is the case for the private wells remaining in the area that is now served by water from Manitowoc. Also, if you can send me a list of the addresses of these remaining private wells, that would be ideal. Thanks in advance for any help you can give me.
