As you know from our telephone call, the WDNR has been doing file audits of old open cases, including this case. This site was documented to have had a spill in 1991, but unfortunately, no documentation exists showing that the site was ever remediated. Our file has notes that suggest an over-excavation of contaminated soil took place. Please have your environmental consultant prepare a sampling plan to confirm that the site is clean, and does not present a threat to groundwater or direct contact. I am enclosing a map so your consultant will know where to take samples, then if clean, they can make a submittal for closure.

You were notified by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) of your responsibility to investigate and, as needed, clean up contamination located at the above-referenced property. As owner of this property you have certain legal responsibilities, as outlined in Section 292.11(3), Wisconsin Stats., also known as the hazardous substances spills law. Section 292.11(3) states:

• RESPONSIBILITY. A person who possesses or controls a hazardous substance which is discharged or who causes the discharge of a hazardous substance shall take the actions necessary to restore the environment to the extent practicable and minimize the harmful effects from the discharge to the air, lands or waters of the State.
