Dear Mr. Klett,

This letter is to inform you that work has been completed at the Town of Wayne farm.

Approximately 125 drums were removed. All drums from the creek and woods have been removed. Also, several drums were discovered north of the barn, near a corn field. These were removed. All rusted and burned out drums and cans in the woods have been removed.

A series of test digs was done. Attached is a sketch of the area showing where test digs occurred. No additional drums were found.

All but approximately 5 or 6 drums were incinerated in our on-site hazardous waste incinerator. I felt this was the best way to deal with the material. The unincinerated drums contained completely gelled polyester resin that could not be broken up to allow incineration. This material will be sent to Omega Hills.

If you would like to look over the farm area please let me know and I will accompany you.
