Hi Pat,

I will be glad to help you. I understand the incinerator will be closed as a "hazardous" waste incinerator but it will remain as incinerator. The closure would be slightly simpler than a closure requiring disposal of the incinerator. I am sure you have a closure plan in the old permit application. You should ask Cook to update the partial closure plan, i.e., incinerator closure, for your approval. If the partial closure plan is approvable, Cook should request a Class 2 Permit mod for public comments and finalize the partial closure plan.

If incinerator closure plan in the original permit application is adequate, you could proceed closure based on the plan without requiring a permit mod. In general the cost estimate has to be update if they are not done on a periodical basis. SC Johnson has closed its boilers recently and they have processed a class 2 mod as described above.

The closure would include cleaning of piping system to reduce toxic hazardous constituents. Ignitable constituents are not our concerns if the unit would remain in operation.
