Subject: Proposed modified groundwater monitoring plan, Cook Composites and Polymers Co., 340 Railroad Street, Saukville, file reference FID #246004330 ERR-LUST

I approve your new monitoring plan based on my review of your consultant's proposal. I understand that you will be using the cost savings to work on alternate remediation methods for the site. It may be the case that your alternate means of remediation will call for an increased rate of sampling in at least some of the wells (such as if you were to try lactate injection). If that is the case this approval will need to be modified.

Since my last letter to you I have looked into our files and found that we do have a copy of the remedial action report dated October of 1996 for the soil remediation done at the churchyard. 7,000 tons of contaminated soil were removed and disposed of, followed by installation of a vapor barrier. Georgia Gulf did not make a closure request, and the department did not issue a closure letter on the status of the soil at the churchyard, but the report is available for you or your consultant's review.
