

Dear Ms. Miller:

Thank you for allowing BT², Inc., the opportunity to provide a proposal for environmental services at the above-referenced site. BT² has significant experience working on Dry Cleaner Environmental Response Fund (DERF) projects, as well as extensive site investigation and remediation experience.

We have prepared a scope and estimated costs for:

- Coordinating access to up to three off-site properties
- Installing and sampling up to 8 Geoprobe TM (geoprobe) borings
- Analyzing up to 8 soil samples
- Installing three water table monitoring wells
- Installing one piezometer
- Conducting two rounds of quarterly groundwater sampling
- Preparing a site investigation report

The remainder of this letter provides information on our project understanding, project scope and workplan, and a summary of estimated project costs and schedule. We assume that the WDNR will approve this workplan without revision.

Project Understanding

We understand that there were dry cleaning operations at the property between the 1950s and the 1970s. Seymour Environmental performed a scoping investigation in 2007. The investigation identified dry cleaner contaminants including tetrachloroethene (PCE) in soil and PCE and trichloroethene (TCE) in groundwater. The WDNR is requiring additional site investigation in order to determine the degree and extent of soil and groundwater impacts.

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Project Scope and Workplan

Geoprobe Borings

We propose to install and sample up to 8 geoprobe borings on the subject property. The boring locations will generally be placed to define the lateral extent of soil contamination. Final boring locations will be determined in the field based on field observations, utility locations, and general accessibility. We assume that all borings will be installed on the source property and up to three off-site properties (e.g., neighboring properties or street right of ways).

We propose to install the borings to a depth of approximately 24 feet below ground surface (bgs) to provide vertical definition of soil contamination. Soil samples will be collected continuously from all soil borings and described according to the Unified Soil Classification System (USCS), noting stratigraphy and moisture. Soil will be screened at 2-foot intervals using a photoionization detector (PID).

One soil sample from each boring will be submitted to a fixed-base laboratory for analysis for VOCs. Soil sample collection depths will be determined based on field observations, including PID results, but will generally be selected to provide vertical definition of the soil contamination. All borings will be documented and abandoned in accordance with Wisconsin Administrative Code NR 141.

Water Table Wells and Piezometer

As indicated in the Request for Proposal (RFP), we propose to install three water table monitoring wells and one piezometer at the site. The water table wells will be installed to depths of approximately 32 feet bgs. The piezometer will be installed to approximately 52 feet bgs. The water table wells and piezometer will be developed in accordance with NR 141, and top-of-casing elevations will be surveyed to mean sea level. We assume that bedrock drilling is not necessary and that a geoprobe rig equipped with hollow-stem augers can set the wells. The costs presented in this proposal do not include bedrock drilling.

Following the installation of the new wells and piezometer, we will collect two rounds of groundwater samples from all site wells and the piezometer. Groundwater samples will be submitted for laboratory analysis for VOCs.

Investigative Waste Management

All soil cuttings from geoprobe borings and monitoring well installation activities will be placed in 55-gallon steel drums and left on site pending receipt of analytical results. We propose to use analytical results from the geoprobe soil sampling to arrange for disposal of the soil cuttings at a licensed solid waste facility (landfill). If analytical results from geoprobe soil samples indicate that contaminant concentrations could potentially be characteristically hazardous under NR 600 rules, additional sampling of drummed soil will be necessary to determine if the waste is hazardous. Our proposal includes the cost to analyze one soil sample for VOCs via the Toxicity Characteristic Leaching Procedure (TCLP) to determine if drummed waste is characteristically hazardous. Costs to manage hazardous wastes are not included in this proposal.

Monitoring well development and purge water will also be contained in 55-gallon steel drums. We assume that the water can be disposed at a publicly owned treatment works (POTW). Our costs assume that monitoring well water will not be hazardous. Costs to manage hazardous wastes are not included in this proposal.

Reporting

A report that documents the field investigation activities and presents the investigation results will be prepared following an evaluation of the field and laboratory data. The report will include the following:

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- Description of sampling activities and laboratory analysis
- WDNR soil boring logs, boring abandonment forms, well construction forms, and well development forms
- Tabulated results of laboratory chemical analysis performed on soil and groundwater samples
- Site location map
- Site figure with boring locations
- Recommendations for additional investigation or remediation, if necessary

Estimated Cost

A detailed cost estimate for each phase of work is attached as required (Attachment 1). We estimate \$22,803 in DERF-eligible project costs.

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TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- PAYMENT: Invoices will be submitted by BT² to Client monthly or upon completion of specific services with payment of the invoices being due upon receipt. Any unpaid and delinquent invoices shall bear interest at one and one-half percent per month, commencing thirty days from the date of invoice. Any attorneys' fees, court costs and other related expenses incurred by BT² in the collection of delinquent invoice amounts shall be paid by Client. In the event any payment due BT² under the terms of this Work Authorization (herein "Authorization") is delinquent, BT² may suspend all services until all delinquent payments have been received. Fees charged do not include any state, federal or local applicable taxes, and taxes will be the responsibility of the Client.
- 2. ACCEPTANCE: If BT² is given a verbal or written notification to proceed without first receiving a signed copy of the Authorization, it will be mutually understood that Client and BT² will nonetheless be contractually bound by the Authorization and Terms and Conditions, even in the absence of written acceptance by either party. BT² may withhold a written report until it receives the Authorization signed by Client.
- 3. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR STATUS: BT² shall be fully independent in performing the services and shall not act as an agent or employee of Client. BT² shall perform its work as an independent contractor, and shall have responsibility for and control over details and means of the performance for the work described in the Authorization. BT² shall be solely responsible for the compensation, benefits, contributions and taxes, if any, of its employees, sub-contractors, and agents.
- 4. WARRANTY OF CONSULTANT: BT² represents that the services will be performed within the limits prescribed by Client and will be conducted in a manner consistent with that level of care and skill ordinarily exercised by members of the profession currently practicing under similar circumstances. Further, Client acknowledges that the adequacy of any written or oral report prepared by BT² is limited by Client's determination of the services to be provided by BT² and, therefore, BT² cannot guarantee the adequacy of BT²'s report or the conclusions contained therein. No other representations or warranties on the part of BT², whether express or implied, are included or intended in this Authorization, the Attachments or Exhibits hereto, or BT²'s report.
- 5. INSURANCE: BT² represents that it is protected by Worker's Compensation insurance and that BT² has coverage under liability insurance policies that BT² deems reasonable and adequate. Upon request, BT² shall furnish certificates of insurance to the Client evidencing the risks insured against, and the limits of liability thereunder. In the event the Client requires specific inclusions of coverage in addition to that obtained by BT², or increased limits of liability in BT²'s liability policies, the cost of such inclusions or increased limits shall be borne by the Client.
- 6. BT²'s LIABILITY: BT²'s aggregate liability for damages arising out of the services rendered pursuant to this Authorization, whether arising out of tort or contract, is limited to an amount not to exceed \$50,000, or the total gross billings of BT² to the Client hereunder, whichever is less. BT² is not liable for any consequential, special,

- punitive, or indirect damages, including but not limited to lost profits, loss of use of property and Client's breach of other contracts. BT² will be responsible only for the activities of its employees and for BT²'s subcontractors. BT² shall not be responsible for the activities of any other contractors directly engaged by Client.
- INDEMNIFICATION: Subject to the limitations set forth below, BT² shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless Client and its subsidiaries and affiliates, and their respective shareholders, directors, officers, employees, agents, and subcontractors ("BT2 Indemnitees") from and against any and all claims, demands, losses, damages, fines, costs, and expenses of every nature, including reasonable attorneys' fees ("Claims"), incurred or suffered by any BT² Indemnitee as a result of claims asserted by third parties unaffiliated with Client which arise from (a) the negligent acts or willful misconduct of BT² in performing services under this Authorization, except to the extent such claims result from the negligent acts or omissions of Client or any BT² Indemnitee, the inaccuracy or incompleteness of information provided by Client or any material breach by Client of its obligations under this Authorization, or (b) any material breach of this Authorization by BT². BT²'s indemnification obligation hereunder is limited to the limits of BT²'s insurance coverage applicable to the Claims.

Client shall, to the maximum extent permitted by law, indemnify, defend and hold harmless BT 2 and its shareholders, directors, officers, employees, agents, and subcontractors from and against any and all Claims which any of them may incur or suffer or which may be asserted by a person whomsoever which arise out of or are in any way connected with (a) any condition existing at the Project prior to the commencement of BT 2's services; (b) any release or threat of release, discharge, dispersal, or migration of waste materials, whether the same occurs before or after the commencement of BT 2's services, except to the extent the same results from the negligent act or willful misconduct of BT2, or any generation, treatment, storage, transport or disposal of waste materials, or any reporting or failure to report any of the foregoing to governmental authorities; (c) any Claim of which BT 2 expressly has no liability under this Authorization; (d) the acts or omissions of Client and its subsidiaries and affiliates and their respective shareholders, officers, directors, employees, agents, contractors, or subcontractors; (e) the operation or management of the services by others; (f) any inaccuracy in any Client representation or warranty or any material breach by Client under this Authorization; (g) any unmarked or incorrectly marked subterranean structures. even if BT² helped arrange for marking or locating the utility or structure; or (h) handling, transportation and disposal of any Wastes, as defined in Paragraph 13 hereof, in the course of BT2's performance of services under this Authorization. Client waives and releases any claim against BT² arising from or relating to any of the foregoing.

8. UTILITIES: The Client agrees to provide such information regarding the site(s) at which services will be performed to allow safe and proper conduct of BT²'s work. The information shall include, but not necessarily be limited to, the location of on-site and off-site utilities, asbuilt or other drawings, or existing known contaminants or other knowledge as appropriate. Client may request, but BT² is not obligated to provide, assistance with arranging for public utility or private locators.

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- 9. CONSTRUCTION LIEN NOTICE: As required by the Wisconsin Construction Lien Law, BT² hereby notifies Client that persons or companies furnishing labor or materials for the construction, or services provided, on Client's land may have lien rights on Client's land and building if not paid. Those entitled to lien rights, in addition to the undersigned BT², are those who contract directly with Client or those who give Client notice within 60 days after they first furnish labor or materials for construction or performance of services. Accordingly, Client probably will receive notices from those who furnish labor or materials for the construction or performance of services, and should give a copy of each notice received to the mortgage lender, if any. BT² agrees to cooperate with Client and Client's lender, if any, to see that all potential lien claimants are duly paid.
- 10. FORCE MAJEURE: Neither party shall be deemed in default of this Authorization to the extent that any delay or failure in the performance of its obligations (other than the payment of money) results, without its fault or negligence, from any cause beyond its reasonable control, including, without limitation, acts of God, acts of civil or military authority, embargoes, epidemics, war, riots, insurrections, fires, explosions, earthquakes, floods, adverse weather conditions, acts of other contractors, strikes, or lock-outs.
- 11. GOVERNING LAW: This Authorization shall be governed by and interpreted pursuant to the laws of the State of Wisconsin.
- 12. RIGHT-OF-ENTRY: Client will furnish right-of-entry for BT² to such property as may be necessary for BT² to perform the services under this Authorization. BT² will take reasonable precautions to minimize damage to any such property caused by BT²'s equipment, but has not included in BT²'s Authorization the cost of restoration of damage which may result from BT²'s operations. If Client requires BT² to restore property to its former condition, Client shall so notify BT² in writing prior to executing this Authorization and the costs associated with such restoration shall be added to BT²'s fee and paid by Client.
- 13. HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES AND PREEXISTING CONDITIONS: If state or federally regulated hazardous, toxic or dangerous wastes as defined by state or federal regulations (hereinafter "Wastes") are encountered at the site, and if these Wastes require handling, transportation or disposal at an off-site facility BT² will assist in advising the Client of the Client's options. Client acknowledges that BT² is not an "arranger", "transporter", "generator" or "operator" (as those terms are defined in any environmental federal, state or local statute or ordinance) with respect to the Wastes and that BT² will not accept title to, sign manifests for, or take control of any Wastes.
- 14. ASSIGNMENT AND SUBCONTRACT: BT² shall not assign this Authorization without prior written consent of Client, but may employ any other party it deems necessary or proper for any part of the services required to be performed by BT² under the terms of this Authorization. Client shall not assign this Authorization without prior written consent of BT².

- 15. **TERMINATION**: Either party may terminate this Authorization at any time upon written notice to the other sent to the address set forth on the Authorization. In such events, BT² will be compensated for services performed under this Authorization to the termination date together with all costs arising out of such termination.
- 16. TIME LIMIT FOR CLAIMS: Any claim brought by Client against BT² will be brought not later than one year after the date of substantial completion of BT²'s services for which the claim is made or the expiration of the appropriate statute of limitation, whichever is earlier.
- 17. ENTIRE AGREEMENT: The terms and conditions set forth herein along with the Authorization (and any referenced attachments) constitute the entire understanding of the parties relating to the provision of services by BT and supersede all prior or contemporaneous communications, representations or agreements, whether oral or written, between the parties. No alterations to or modifications of the terms and conditions of this Authorization shall be effective unless such alteration or such modification is reduced to writing and properly executed by the parties hereto.
- 18. SEVERABILITY: The invalidity or unenforceability of any particular provision of this Authorization or any portion thereof shall not affect the other provisions hereof, and the Authorization shall be construed in all respects as if such invalid or unenforceable provision or any portion thereof were omitted.
- 19. ENVIRONMENTAL SITE ASSESSMENTS: BT²'s Environmental Site Assessment reports represent our professional judgment and are limited to those site conditions and potential impacts from neighboring properties that could be discovered under the scope of services authorized by the Authorization. The conclusions and interpretations of Environmental Site Assessment reports do not collectively define all the risks associated with purchase or other use of a property. While attempts have been made to relate the data and findings to applicable environmental laws and regulations, the report shall not be construed to offer legal opinion or representations as to the requirements of, or compliance with environmental laws, rules, regulations or policies of federal, state or local government agencies.
- 20. USE OF DOCUMENTS: All reports and other documents prepared by BT² under this Authorization are instruments of service of BT² and BT² shall retain a property interest in those reports and documents until Client has made full payment to BT² for such documents pursuant to this Authorization. All reports and documents generated by BT² pursuant to this Authorization are not intended or suitable for reuse by Client or any other party for any purpose. Reuse of any reports or documents for any other purpose without written consent of BT² shall be at Client's and the user's sole risk without any liability on BT²'s part. The provisions of this Paragraph 20 shall survive the termination of this Authorization.
