Monthly Progress Report for November 1991 Moss-American Site, Milwaukee, Wisconsin

## Gentlemen:

Roy F. Weston, Inc. (WESTON) has prepared this monthly progress report on behalf of the settling defendant for the Moss-American Superfund site, Kerr-McGee Chemical Corporation (KMCC). This monthly progress report has been prepared to document progress achieved by KMCC during November.

## Progress During November 1991

The following summary of progress is presented for this reporting period:

- WESTON and KMCC submitted a draft Interim Quality Assurance Project Plan (QAPP) and Field Sampling Plan (FSP) to U.S. EPA and WDNR on 18 November 1991. This QAPP and FSP addresses predesign Task 2 as it relates to the determination of background CPAH concentration in soils and sediments.
- WESTON and KMCC finalized revisions to the Interim Predesign Work Plan and prepared the document for transmittal to U.S. EPA and WDNR on 3 December 1991.
- KMCC and Covington & Burling (attorney for KMCC) prepared a revised access and in-kind services agreement for review by the County of Milwaukee. KMCC continues to attempt to make progress in obtaining access to county and railroad properties of the Moss-American site.
- KMCC's public relations consultant accompanied KMCC to meet with U.S. EPA and discuss the initial development efforts of a public relations program for the site.

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- Under Predesign Task 6, WESTON conducted water level readings in existing on-site groundwater monitoring wells, and installed a stage gage along the Little Menomonee River adjacent to the former wood preserving plant property. The stage gage consists of a surveyed rod driven into the lower bank of the river.
- Under Predesign Task 8, WESTON compiled and evaluated area groundwater use information provided by U.S. EPA and WDNR.
- Under Predesign Task 10, WESTON continued work on the river hydraulics studies as outlined in the Interim Work Plan.
- · Under Predesign Task 16, WESTON and KMCC evaluated technical and cost proposals received in response to our Request for Proposal (RFP) for conducting bench-scale treatability testing of the bioslurry and soil washing treatment technology. Contractor selection is anticipated in late December 1991 or January 1992.
- WESTON's surveying subcontractor completed final plotting of the site topographic map detail during this period.

## Activities Anticipated During December

KMCC and WESTON anticipate conducting the following predesign activities during December 1991:

For planning purposes, KMCC and WESTON request an update from U.S. EPA on the status and timing of the consent decree lodging.

- Conduct short-list interviews in progressing toward selection of a qualified contractor for conducting benchscale bioslurry and soil washing treatability studies (predesign Task 16).
- Continue progress on implementation of those predesign tasks outlined in the approved Interim Predesign Work Plan.
