Progress During January 2004

Progress during this reporting period includes:

- On 12 January KMC submitted to the Agencies a report summarizing our findings on the forensic analysis of the contributors of CPAHs to Little Menomonee River sediments and floodplain soils. We wish to further discuss this report with the Agencies and its implications regarding the ROD remedy for Reaches 4 and 5.
- On 27 January KMC/WESTON reached agreement with WDNR regarding comments provided on the Prefinal Design Report for Reaches 2 and 3.

Activities Anticipated During February 2004

During February KMC/WESTON anticipate the following activities:

- On 2 February KMC/WESTON received notification from U.S. EPA that all
 comments on the Prefinal Design Report for Reaches 2 and 3 were satisfactorily
 addressed. KMC/WESTON/Inter-Fluve will finalize the comment responses and then
 prepare the Final Design Report for Reaches 2 and 3 with an anticipated submittal date
 of 13 Feb.
- The Q4 2003 groundwater monitoring report will be prepared.



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• KMC/WESTON will submit a monitoring report for Reach 1.
