Steve,

You are correct, based on our recent review of site conditions, the DNR has agreed that no further groundwater investigation is required for this site and does not expect that further sampling of these wells to be needed. However, as the site investigation (and potentially remediation) is not complete, and more information will be obtained, the DNR cannot guarantee that groundwater sample data from this general area would not be needed in the future if our understanding of the site changes.

The monitoring wells can be abandoned at any time without DNR approval. It is ultimately up to the property owner or responsible party to determine when they should be removed.

D&C Partners contacted me this morning regarding the addition to the building that is currently being constructed on site. The contractor is on site doing foundation work and they discovered that monitoring wells MW-6 and PZ-3 are located within the foundation foot print.
