Thanks for getting back to me regarding the sub-slab sampling for petroleum vapors at your property referenced above. You have elected not to accept our offer to have the sub-slab samples analyzed for petroleum compounds in addition to chlorinated compounds. DNR accepts your decision. The sub-slab vapor samples scheduled to be collected next week will only be analyzed for chlorinated compounds related to the adjacent Econo Wash site (BRRTS # 02-43-547861).

Keep in mind that the above referenced contamination case on your property was closed in 2006 with petroleum contamination remaining in soil and groundwater. Vapor intrusion into buildings was not assessed as that was not required at that time to get closure approval.

Carrie,

I'm curious if you have had a chance to consider our offer to include petroleum compounds as part of the upcoming vapor sampling event below your building floor? This not required and completely your decision. The purpose of including the petroleum compounds would be to determine if the remaining petroleum contamination from the closed case on your property potentially could be causing vapor intrusion concerns within your building. If petroleum contamination in the vapor samples below your building floor are found to be above the vapor risk screening levels, more work would likely have to be done by you as the current property owner. The main reason for us doing this work is to confirm if chlorinated compounds (stemming from dry cleaning chemicals) are present below your building floor. Based on what is currently known, the chlorinated compounds are coming from an off-site source and you are not considered responsible for the contamination.

Due to the age of the petroleum contamination case (Howlin & Grooming – BRRTS # 03-43-520433) on your property closed in July 2006, sub-slab vapor sampling/assessment was not part of the case closure requirements at that time. We can easily expand the sampling parameters and include petroleum contaminants if you would like us to do so when we are there collecting the vapor
