Anthony,

It was nice talking with you today about this site and the recently submitted Groundwater Monitoring Status Report. In summary, the groundwater concentrations appear to be slowly increasing in MW-1, MW-2, MW-3 and MW-6. MW-6 is concerning because it is the downgradient well and is coming close to exceeding the ES for PCE. Though the levels of contamination are relatively low at this site, groundwater monitoring over the last 14 years does not provide confidence in near term case closure without additional remedial action as suggested in the June 2017 case closure denial letter. At this time, the DNR is not comfortable with the proposal to reduce groundwater monitoring to annual sampling and recommends continued semi-annual sampling and further discussion with your client on a strategy to bring this site to case closure.
