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John,

The excavation and treatment of drycleaning soil went very well – all treated test results passed, and we’ve finished with the excavation of the direct landfill soil also.

We had the site nearly backfilled and were removing footings when we found two old underground petroleum tanks on the southwest corner of the property. The tanks had been abandoned previously and are full of water – and I think Pea gravel – we’ll find out tomorrow. I’m having them removed tomorrow – with a remover cleaner, we contacted the inspection agency, forms will be filled out to register them.

The soils around the tanks smell like petroleum, and we’ll be landfilling the soil upon excavation in the Biopile. I’ll grab edge and floor samples and we will see how the results look, and decide if we need a well in that area to monitor post-excavation.

With all the prior borings and soil sampling, and the historic groundwater sampling, it would appear the petroleum hasn’t moved much.
