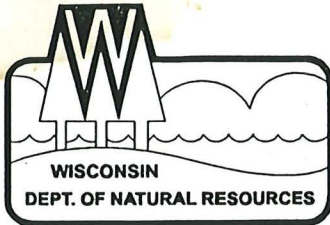

Parsons returned my call.

I asked about the statement in the 9/10/99 update letter regarding PMW-15 not being needed. Parsons said she would have to check on that, but Parsons thought the reference was about data collected to date pointing to not needing the deep piezometer. Parsons suggested that we look at the results of the May sampling round before deciding what else might be needed for monitoring. Parsons also mentioned that Eric Christensen was "pretty well tapped out" (financially) by the end of 1999, and wouldn't be in favor of spending more money on investigation. I said that it would be OK to wait for the May results before deciding what to do next.

I also asked about a more ~~detailed~~ detailed inspection and maintenance plan for the capped areas of the site. Parsons said this information would be included with the May sample results, probably sent out in June or July. to be

Dear Mr. Christiansen:

The Department's Remediation and Redevelopment program has received the *Remedial Action Documentation Report*, prepared for the above named site by Natural Resource Technology, Inc., (NRT) and dated January 21, 2000. The report describes activities conducted to remediate soil contaminated with pentachlorophenol and fuel oil. The remedial action involved the excavation and landfill disposal of approximately 3,700 tons of soil and debris, the treatment of 18,160 gallons of groundwater, and the capping of areas of residual soil contamination to address direct contact concerns.

Based on a review of the report, the overall results of the remedial action appear to have been successful. Post-excavation sampling has demonstrated that the vast majority of soil impacted above NRT's calculated residual contaminant levels has been removed from the site, and the remaining impacted soil is either located at depth or has been capped with additional soil cover. NRT will now attempt to demonstrate through monitoring that the residual soil contamination will not continue to impact groundwater, and the current groundwater contamination will naturally attenuate.

My review did generate the following questions and concerns, which I discussed with Laurie Parsons of NRT on March 17, 2000:

1. You will need to submit a more detailed plan for the inspection and maintenance of areas that were capped to address the direct contact threat. An engineering control such as the soil capping used here is only effective as long as it is maintained. The inspection and maintenance plan will likely need to be recorded as a deed restriction on the site's property deed. Ms. Parsons has informed me that the inspection and maintenance documentation will likely be provided along with the results of the May 2000 groundwater sampling round, some time in June or July of this year.
2. As I pointed out in a letter dated April 6, 1999, remediation of soil to an industrial residual contaminant level requires the recording of a deed restriction per s. NR 720.11(1)(c), Wis. Adm. Code, to insure that the property remains in industrial usage. Proof that this restriction has been recorded must be submitted to the Department.

3. You will also need to submit evidence, in the form of proof sheets from the newspaper and/or photocopies of the newspaper itself, that the class I public notice as required by ss. NR 714.07(5) and NR 722.09(2)(a)2., Wis. Adm. Code, has been published. The public notice is required for the soil performance standard approach that you are using. I received from you on May 14, 1999 a draft of a public notice, but I have not received a copy of the notice that actually appeared in the newspaper.
4. It was noted in reviewing this report and a previous update from NRT that the proposed deep piezometer (PMW-15) was not installed in March 1999, and that NRT no longer plans to install this well. The Department is concerned that vertical migration of groundwater contaminants might be occurring; the deep piezometer would be needed to determine if this is the case. I discussed this with Ms. Parsons last week, and we agreed to discuss this issue further once the results from the May 2000 sampling round are available.

I telephoned Christiansen to get an update on the sediment portion of the project.

Christiansen said they have looked over the work plan comments from Tom Janisch, and need to get back to NRT. Christiansen also mentioned that the work plan was partly written by Rick Fox of Hart-Crowser, and Christiansen doesn't even know if Fox is available now to work on this project. Christiansen also said that NRT is at the end of the construction season, and NRT staff are not always available.

I told Christiansen I thought the field work should be conducted yet this fall, since we were looking more at chemical rather than biotic parameters. Christiansen did not think it would be feasible to do the field work this year. I suggested that Christiansen, NRT and I at least start talking about the investigation, and if the field work gets put off until next spring, at least we should have agreement on what will and won't be part of the

Nordeen said the property he's interested in is on the east side of Military Creek, approximately 500-600 feet from the creek. The property is about 1/3 of a mile from the site. According to Nordeen, the property is on municipal sewer and water. Based on this information, I told Nordeen that the property would not likely be at risk of contamination from the site.

Nordeen said he was also concerned about a former "chemical plant" owned by Christensen that is actually closer to the property. Nordeen said charcoal briquets and nitric acid were supposedly produced there. I told Nordeen that this may be the Sylvan Wood Products facility, and said I do not know much about it. I suggested that Nordeen contact Don Miller in Rhinelander to see if Miller knows anything about the "chemical plant".

I just spoke with a Terry Nordine of Phelps. Nordine is interested in buying a (residential?) property in Phelps near the former CM Christiansen site. I spoke with Nordine a little last week, and also referred him to Don in regards to a supposed "chemical plant" nearby. Anyway, Nordine said that his bank wants a letter from DNR stating that his proposed property is clean or something to that effect.

Since this sounds like a request for an off-site letter, I told Nordine to find out exactly what the bank wants, and then describe that in a letter to us (copies will be sent to all three of us). I also told Nordine to include a map of the property he wants to buy so we can relate it to potential contaminant sources. I said that the three of us can then discuss what should go in the letter. I also told Nordine that there would likely be a fee associated with our response letter.

Enclosed is a copy of my bank's request for information on the CM Christenson property and Slvan Products land, a map of the property I am considering purchasing and building a home on in relation to the pole plant, a picture of the property from the 1920's, a copy of the land in question description. Before I purchase the land and build on it I must have some type of verification for the bank that the property is free from contamination and will remain free from contamination, how you are monitoring the situation, possible dangers to the home owner, and what you have done to clean it up. In our conversations this past couple of weeks I had the feeling that the situation is under control. The land is located approximately 0.35 miles and on the other side of military creek from the pole plant and about 0.15-2.0 miles from the Slvan Products offices, but on the same side of military creek.

I feel very comfortable with buying the property, however, I am aware that if this property becomes contaminated while I own it I would be responsible for the clean up which I know is quite expensive. If the property is safe I would be willing to monitor the groundwater for contamination from the pole plant by having a monitoring well placed on the property in question for 10-20 years if needed. Please go over the bank's request with each other. I will try to contact you later this week for an opinion. If the opinion is positive I would need a copy of the report for the bank. You could also contact Fran Paoli at Well Fargo Bank in Ironwood, MI to discuss this with him (877-776-7693).

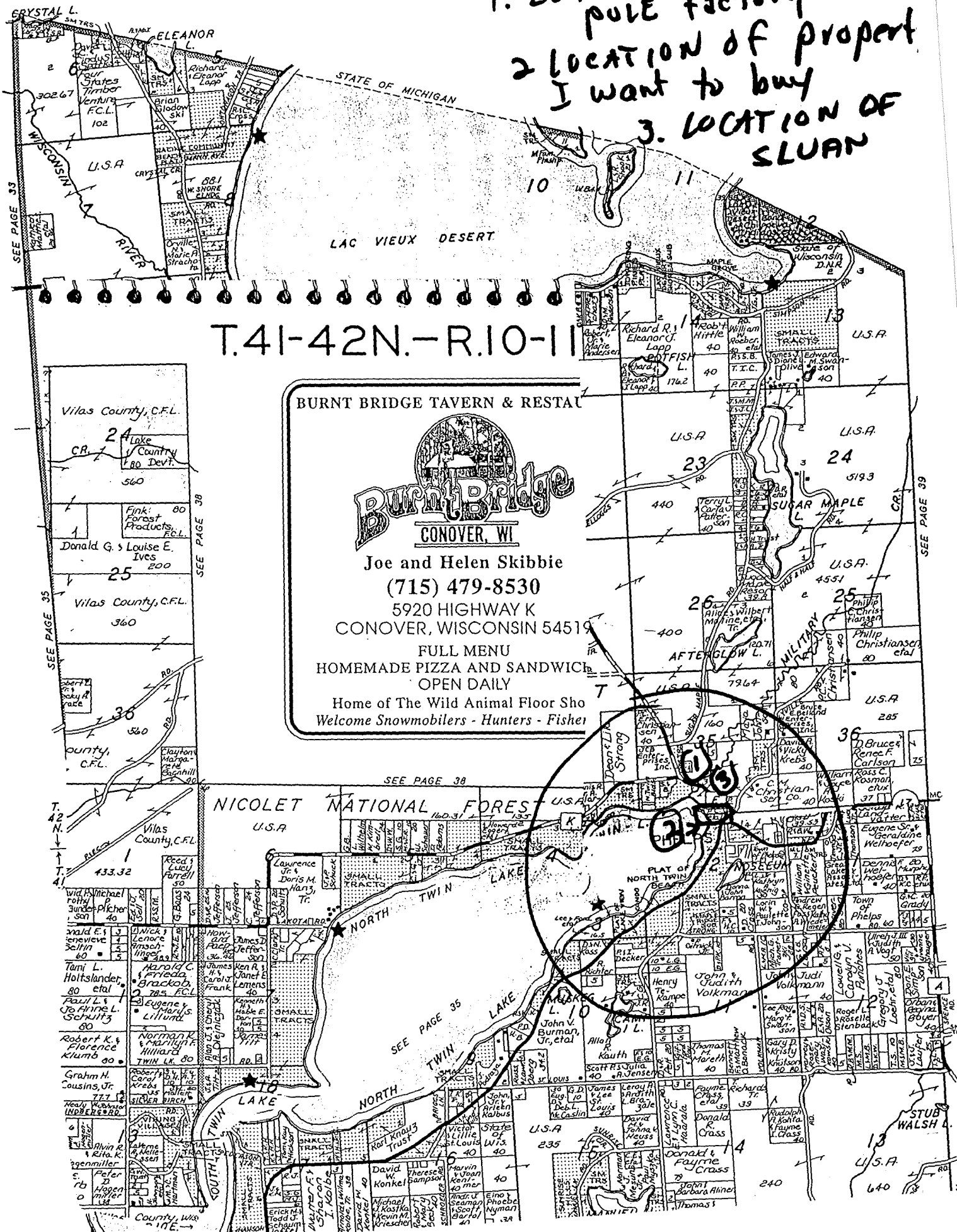

Paoli returned a call to me. I explained that I have been working with Terry Nordine on a potential land purchase in Phelps, and thought that the bank needed to be consulted on the off-site/assurance letter request.

Paoli said his bank had requested a letter from DNR because Nordine told the bank the proposed property was contaminated from an off-site source or sources. I told Paoli that I am working on the former CMC Pole Yard, and thought it unlikely that contamination from the pole yard would make it to Nordine's proposed property. I said I didn't know anything about the Sylvan Wood property, so I couldn't comment on that. I further explained that, in the event that contaminants did migrate onto Nordine's property, there is a statutory exemption for that liability.

Paoli suggested that I put this in writing to Nordine. I replied that DNR doesn't write those types of letters, but I will call Nordine.
