On August 11, 2008, we solicited proposals to conduct a Dry Cleaner Environmental Response ("DERF") Site Investigation for the Property. We have completed the evaluation of these four (4) proposals from Sigma Environmental Services, Inc. ("Sigma"), Giles Èngineering Assoc., Inc. ("Giles"), Terracon Consulting Engineers and Scientists ("Terracon") and KPRG Environmental Consultation & Remediation ("KPRG") and have made a recommendation for consultant selection.

Each consultant that was solicited has considerable DERF experience, references, insurance and credibility that initially prompted us to solicit them. The variability in each proposal is generally found in the scope of work or the activities proposed in order to complete the site investigation. We have briefly summarized each scope of work proposed in each report with respect to the quantity, frequency, media and distribution of data points. We have attempted to compare each proposal for cost-effectiveness and complicity with all applicable requirements and guidelines in order to maximize the DERF reimbursement of the expenses to be incurred. Please review and let us know your thoughts on our final recommendation.

# <u>Sigma</u>

Sigma proposes eight (8) soil samples from eight (8) soil boring locations: two (2) interior to 12' bgs and six (6) exterior to 17' bgs. Each of the borings will be converted to a temporary well. Three (3) monitoring wells will be advanced to 17' bgs

and one (1) piezometer will be advanced to 32' bgs. The wells will be monitored quarterly for three (3) rounds.

Proposal Cost:

\$28,070

## <u>Giles</u>

Giles proposes sixteen (16) soil samples from eight (8) borings: four (4) interior, four (4) exterior, four (4) will be completed as monitoring wells to 16' below ground surface (bgs), and the interior borings will be completed to 16' bgs. All wells will be sampled for four (4) rounds of groundwater monitoring.

Proposal Cost:

\$22,535

# Terracon

Terracon proposes a phased approach with up to twenty-nine (29) soil samples from up to eight (8) exterior and three (3) interior soil borings to 16' bgs. Additionally, eleven (11) temporary wells, four (4) groundwater monitoring wells to 20' bgs and one (1) piezometer to 40' will be advanced. All permanent wells will be sampled for four (4) rounds of groundwater monitoring

Proposal Cost:

\$26,456

## KPRG

KPRG proposes fifteen (15) soil samples from two (2) interior and three (3) exterior soil borings. They propose to install three (3) temporary wells, four (4) monitoring wells to 18' bgs and one (1) piezometer to 45' bgs.

#### Compare/Contrast

All four bids include one sub-slab vapor sample, investigative waste disposal, preparation of a work plan/health and safety plan, bid solicitation for subcontract work, migration pathway/receptor analysis and report preparation. All the bids appear to be compliant with Wis. Admin. Code NR 169.23 in that they contain the obligatory certifications, insurance requirements and project schedule.

Sigma's proposal would likely need to be increased by the costs of performing a fourth round of groundwater monitoring. Giles' scope of work does not seem to address the requirement to investigate groundwater adequately. We believe that a comprehensive proposal should evaluate vertical definition, which includes a piezometer. Terracon's bid included the most number of soil and groundwater samples. They proposed a phased approach in which they would "step out" with the additional work only if the first phase data indicated the next phase was warranted. KPRG submitted a concise and coherent scope of work, however, in comparison to Terracon, they have half as many soil samples and almost a quarter as many temporary wells which can be a cost-effective approach to groundwater monitoring.

#### Recommendation

Based on the quality of bids and the quantity of data that can be generated for the most cost-effective budget, we recommend that **Terracon** be awarded the contract
