Dear Mr. Walsh:

I am pleased to tell you that the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection has closed your agrichemical spill case.

On August 2, 2011, we completed a review of the documentation for the environmental response and clean up of Prowl H2O Herbicide spilled to the sidewalk and street adjacent to Bentert Street at Kettle Lakes Cooperative, 430 1st Street, Random Lake, due to forklift operator error. Based on the information provided, no further investigative or corrective actions are required at this time under Wis. Admin. Code § NR 708.09. If, at some time in the future, the department receives information that indicates additional investigative and/or corrective actions are warranted, the department will require the appropriate action be taken.

In addition, costs incurred during the cleanup of fertilizer or pesticide spills may be reimbursable under the Department's Agricultural Chemical Cleanup Program (ACCP). However, for incurred costs to be eligible for reimbursement, applications for reimbursement must be submitted within 3 years of the costs being incurred.
