Regarding emerging contaminants:

The release that was investigated at this site (BRRTS #03-16-560358) is associated with a former petroleum underground storage tank. Emerging contaminants, such as PFAS compounds, are not associated with petroleum releases. Based on the historic and current use of the site as highway right-of-way, there is no reason to suspect the presence of emerging contaminants at the site. As a result, our site investigation appropriately included petroleum compounds as contaminants of concern and did not include emerging contaminants.
