

CHEMICAL RELEASE AT CHEMDESIGN CORP.

City of Marinette, Marinette County: A chemical release of an ammonia based product occurred at ChemDesign Corp, which affected the nearby Marinette Marine Corp. plant. At 6:07 pm Marinette County Dispatch received a call from Marinette Marine Corp. reporting an odor. The City of Marinette Fire Department/County Hazardous Materials Response Team, responded to the plant. Air monitoring was conducted. The release was confined to ChemDesign and Marinette Marine properties.

Some Marinette Marine Corp. workers complained of nausea and headache. As a precaution, the plant suspended operations and sent all workers from their second shift home early. No one sought medical treatment. The release was stopped by approximately 9:20pm. The Hazardous Materials Team remained on scene to conduct further air monitoring of the buildings and two vessels being built.

The cause of the release is being investigated by ChemDesign personnel.

Greetings Jacob:

I am the Environmental, Health, and Safety Manager for Marinette Marine. I would like to set up a time to meet with you or someone from the EPA to discuss the events that transpired this week and Marinette Marine's concerns. Major concerns are that Chem Design never notified (as far as I am aware of) Marinette Fire Department of any potential releases; Marinette Marine made all calls of concerns requesting fire department to respond. Secondly, Chem Design made no efforts to tell Marinette Marine was occurring or what substance was being smelt until after the fire department arrived and forced the issue. We have over 70 first aid reports of people not feeling well from Tuesday night's release; one person went to the emergency room that night. I have at least three individuals that have lingering effects from breathing in the chemical.

With Chem Design being a chemical manufacturer Marinette Marine has concerns for the 1500+ personnel on its premises. Please let me know if you are the right person to be communicating with to schedule a meeting or whom I should be corresponding with.

Odor Issue for 10/2/2012

Good Morning Michelle

You may have heard already, last night it seems during a processes which includes DMFDMA (1,1-Dimethoxy-N,N-dimethyl Methanamine) one of the circulating pumps attached to one of two of our pre-scrubber totes died mid-process, so an odorous release from the scrubber occurred. With the pre-scrubber pump being down a small portion the DMFDMA odor became airborne out of the scrubber and following the local wind pattern (SE-5 MPH) lost its buoyancy and sank around the Marinette Marine area, specifically around the newer ship docked being worked on at their dock. DMFDMA is a sinker, and has an odor detection level of less than <0.34 ppm (the only odor threshold published by OSHA is for DMA which is the <.34 ppm) so a little goes a long way. Marinette Marine thought it best to evacuate their staff from the vessel until the odor dispersed. A scrubber sample was taken and analyzed, indicating a result of <.004 ppm of DMFDMA present.

Once the odor issue became apparent, (which was before Marinette Marine evacuated their staff) all processes within production building 38 were shut down, the scrubber and pre-scrubber totes were drained, washed and refilled. The process utilizing the DMFDMA has been shut down until all pumps and process equipment is cleaned, checked and verified for proper operation.
