The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources ("the Department") has been notified of tributyltin and mercury contamination in the sediment of Hughitt Slip. The Department is investigating potential sources of this contamination. We are requesting information from you due to the proximity of your property to Hughitt Slip. CHS (formerly Harvest States Cooperatives) owns three parcels adjacent to Hughitt Slip.

The Department is investigating whether you and any past owners or occupants of your property may potentially be responsible for causing or contributing to the tributyltin or mercury contamination. Tributyltin is a compound found in marine antifouling paints, fungicides, and pesticides. The Department is sending this letter to request any information that you can provide regarding the use or storage of chemicals or products containing tributyltin or mercury by yourself or other past owners or occupants of your property.

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources ("the Department") has been notified of contamination in the sediment of Hughitt Slip and Cummings Slip. The sediment in Hughitt Slip contains elevated concentrations of mercury and tributyltin, and the sediment in Cummings Slip contains elevated concentrations of polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs), lead, and mercury. The Department is investigating potential sources of this contamination. We are requesting information from you because your properties at 106 John Avenue, 107 Hughitt Avenue, and 211 Hughitt Avenue are in close proximity to Hughitt Slip and Cummings Slip.
