Hey Tauren,

The purpose of this e-mail is to respond to the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR) request to collect an additional one year of semi-annual potable well samples from 2519 Woodland Drive and 2722 Woodland Drive in Manitowoc, WI. As noted in your e-mail below, the intent of the additional sampling request is to confirm that per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) concentrations in these two potable wells continue to be below Wisconsin Department of Health Services (WDHS) recommended health advisory levels so a decision can be made regarding bottled water service.

Ramboll, on behalf of Newell Operating Company (NOC), is providing this confirmation that NOC agrees to conduct one year of semi-annual potable well sampling for PFAS compounds at 2519 Woodland Drive and 2722 Woodland Drive in Manitowoc, WI. PFAS samples will be collected consistent with the procedures used during our prior sampling event. The two sampling events are anticipated to be completed in May and November of 2023. The results will be provided to the homeowner and WDNR within 15-days of each sampling event, as previously approved by the

WDNR. Following completion of these two additional WDNR requested sampling events and based on your attached e-mail correspondence, the anticipated comprehensive potable well sampling report documenting the potable well sampling activities completed by NOC will be deferred to the first quarter of 2024.

Good morning,

The potable well sampling results received on January 5, 2023, from Ramboll, on behalf of Newell Operating Company, have been reviewed by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) and Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS). In December 2021, detections of PFAS above the DHS recommended health advisory levels were found in potable wells during an initial sampling event. Subsequent sampling events completed in July/August 2022 and November 2022 did not have any exceedances above the DHS recommended health advisory levels.

Before a determination can be made on continued bottled water service based on the current data, DNR is requesting that the responsible parties (RPs) agree to continuing to sample at least the potable wells at 2519 and 2722 Woodland Drive for two more semi-annual rounds in 2023 to ensure potable well results will remain below the DHS recommended health advisory levels. After these two rounds of semi-annual sampling are completed, the RPs can re-evaluate to determine if a longer-term monitoring plan for potable wells is needed. Please provide your response by February 24, 2023.

In addition, Geosyntec, on behalf of Tramontina U.S. Cookware, Inc., submitted a Site Investigation Report on December 15, 2022, for additional on-site investigation of soil and groundwater. Based on the results, additional investigation is needed, which includes moving off-site. A site investigation work plan will need to be submitted to continue the investigation within the next 60 days. Based on results of future off-site investigation, potable well sampling may potentially be needed.
