Dear Mr. Alido:

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) received the above "South Parking Lot Memorandum" dated March 1, 2021 from KPRG. The DNR reviews environmental investigation and remediation cases for compliance with state statutes and rules to maintain consistency in the investigation and remediation of these cases. After review of the above report, DNR is conditionally approving the Interim Action with the conditions listed below, however additional remedial activities will be required to decrease the groundwater concentrations on and off-site.

1. Collect soil samples from the sidewalls and floor after the remedial excavation to document soil concentrations after soil removal. Additional sidewall and base sampling should be done at 20-foot intervals to verify the residual soil levels. Use of soil borings is helpful to guide the excavation but due to the heterogeneous nature of fill material, verification samples will be needed even where soil borings indicate the limit of contamination has been reached.
2. Provide a Remedial Documentation Report after the soil excavation and disposal is complete. The report should include a figure and at least one cross section (N-S preferred to show utilities to the north and neighboring property/building to the south) depicting the extent of the excavation and sample results posted on the figure. Additional remedial activities may be required based on the results of this Interim Action.
