


## **Douglas County WI GIS Map**

Inspections were done througout the summer between June 1 and Oct 1, 2008

Inspectors walked and waded their assigned sections. In addition, on Lake Cleanup Day (July 5), the shoreline was inspected for AIS while trash was collected by volunteers. Scuba divers also inspected the area near the boat landing and at Forbes' Cove.

Several suspicious plants were turned in. The specimens were Northern Water Milfoil and Clasping-leaf Pondweed. As in 2007, snails and a few crayfish were brought in. None were AIS.

The scuba divers found no AIS but quite a lot of cans, bottles, fishing lures and other junk at the two sites they checked. They went to a depth of approximately 30 feet.
