A SOLE ORDINANCE TO REGULATE BOATING UPON THE WATERS OF LAKE SINISSIPPI AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF.

The Board of Commissioners of the Lake Sinissippi Improvement District in the Towns of Hubbard and Hustisford, in Dodge County, do ordain as follows:

Section 1: Applicability and Enforcement

- (a) The provisions of this ordinance shall apply to the waters of Lake Sinissippi.
- (b) The provisions of the ordinance shall be enforced by the officers of the Towns of Hubbard and Hustisford.

Section 2: Intent

The intent of this ordinance is to provide safe and healthful conditions for the enjoyment of aquatic recreation consistent with public rights and interests, and the capability of the water resources.

Section 3: State Boating and Safety Laws Adopted

State boating laws as found in ss. 30.50 to 30.71, Wis. Stats., are adopted by reference.

Section 4: Definitions

- (a) "Slow-No-Wake" means that speed at which a boat moves as slowly as possible while still maintaining steerage control.
- (b) Buoys are floating markers that clearly identify Slow-No-Wake. The buoys are to conform to standard specifications for navigational markers.

Section 5: Controlled Area

No person shall operate a boat faster than Slow-No-Wake in the waters of Lake Sinissippi: (1) approximately 500 feet offshore of the Sinissippi public hunting grounds on an east-west line from Von Schledorn peninsula to Radlofs Plat, (2) in the bay to the west of Wildcat Road and Sinissippi Bay subdivision, and (3) in the bay at the mouth of Dead Creek.

Section 6: Posting Requirements

The Lake Sinissippi Improvement District shall place and maintain a synopsis of this ordinance at all public access points within the jurisdiction of the District pursuant to the requirements of NR 5.15 Wis. Admin. Code.

Section 7: Penalties

Wisconsin state boating penalties as found in Wis. Stat. 30.80, and deposits as established in the Uniform Deposit and Bail Schedule established by the Wisconsin Judicial Conference, are hereby adopted by reference and all references to fines amended to forfeitures and all references to imprisonment deleted.

Section 8: Severability

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed severable and it is expressly declared that the,Lake District Board would have passed the other provisions of this Ordinance irrespective of whether or not one or more provisions may be declared invalid. If any provision of this Ordinance or the application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the Ordinance and the application of such provisions to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected.

Section 9: Effective Date

This section will become effective upon passage and the day after publication.
