WHEREAS, the 2004 Rhythm and Booms celebration will be held at Warner Park on Saturday, July 3, or on the rain date of Monday, July 5, 2004; and

WHEREAS, the City of Madison will have the responsibility to provide for the safety and protection of those attending the Rhythm and Booms celebration; and


WHEREAS, fireworks for the celebration are launched from an island surrounded by the lagoon; and

WHEREAS, the Madison Police Department, which is the lead agency coordinating security issues for Rhythm and Booms, has identified the need to restrict entry to the Warner Park lagoon and its connecting waterway to Lake Mendota in order to keep spectators from entering the fireworks safety zone; and

WHEREAS, for safety and security reasons, the Madison Police Department has determined it necessary to place waterway markers to exclude boating and swimming in the Warner Park lagoon and its connecting waterway to Lake Mendota; and

WHEREAS, one of the conditions for the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources approval is an authorizing resolution approving such closure adopted by the local unit of government abutting the effected waters.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Common Council of the City of Madison hereby authorizes the closure of the Warner Park lagoon and its waterway connecting to Lake Mendota on July 3 and July 5, 2004, in furtherance of the safety and protection of attendees of the Rhythm and Booms celebration.



14.39 WATERWAYS AND SHORELINE RESTRICTIONS FOR SPECIAL EVENTS.

- (1) No person shall enter an area that is marked with "restricted area" waterway markers in the waters under the control of the City of Madison when a resolution has been passed by the Common Council prohibiting such entry, except as provided in Subsection 2. The resolution shall state the date, time, and location regarding when and where this restriction will be in effect. This restriction may remain in effect for a period not to exceed fourteen (14) days. This restriction will be posted at all public access points when in effect.
- (2) Beginning at Midnight on August 22, 2002, until 6:00 a.m. August 25, 2002, Olin Beach, Olin Boat Launch and the Olin Park shoreline will be closed. Additionally, nine hundred (900) feet of shoreline from Wingra Creek to Turville Woods and extending out one hundred fifty (150) feet from said shoreline will also be closed and marked as "restricted areas" in conjunction with the Madison Blues Festival.

14.45 **PENALTY.**

- (1) Any person violating any provision of Section 14.30(5) shall forfeit not more than \$50. Any person violating any other provision of Section 14.30 or any provisions of Sections 14.31-14.34 of this chapter for which a penalty is not provided by Section 14.45(2) or (3) shall forfeit not more than \$50 for the first offense and shall forfeit not more than \$100 upon conviction of the same offense a second or subsequent time within one year. (Am. by Ord. 12,130, 5-18-98)
- Any person violating Section 30.67(1) or 30.68(1) or (2) Wis. Stats. shall be fined not more than \$200. Any person violating Section 30.68 Wis. Stats. shall be required to obtain a certificate of satisfactory completion of a safety course under Section 30.74(1) Wis. Stats. Any person violating Section 30.67(2) Wis. Stats. shall forfeit not more than \$200.
- (3) Any person violating Section 30.71 Wis. Stats. or any rule promulgated under that section shall forfeit not more than \$100 for the first offense and shall forfeit not more than \$200 upon conviction of the same offense a second or subsequent time within one year.
