

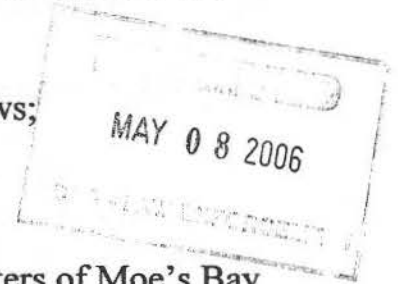

SLOW-NO-WAKE ORDINANCE AFFECTING MOE'S BAY WITHIN
WHITEFISH LAKE

A SOLE ORDINANCE TO REGULATE BOATING UPON THE WATERS OF
MOE'S BAY WITHIN WHITEFISH LAKE IN THE TOWN OF SAND LAKE,
SAWYER COUNTY, WISCONSIN, AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR
VIOLATION THEREOF.

The Town Board of the Town of Sand Lake does ordain as follows;



Section I. Applicability and Enforcement

(a) The provisions of this Ordinance shall apply to the waters of Moe's Bay
within Whitefish Lake located within the Town of Sand Lake, Sawyer County,
Wisconsin.

(b) This ordinance shall be enforced by Sawyer County's Recreational
Safety Warden, who is a certified Wisconsin Law Enforcement Officer.

Section II. Intent

The intent of this ordinance is to provide safe and healthful conditions for
the enjoyment of aquatic recreation consistent with public rights and interest, and the
capability of the water resources, including wildlife habitat and shoreline erosion.

Section III. State Boating and Safety Laws Adopted.

State boating laws as found in §30.50 to 30.71, Wis. Stats. are adopted by
reference.

Section IV. Definitions

(a) "Slow-No-Wake" means that speed at which a boat moves as slowly
as possible while still maintaining steering control

(b) The definition of a boat, for the purpose of this ordinance, includes
personal water craft.

Section V. Controlled Area

No person shall operate a boat faster than slow-no-wake in the waters of Moe's Bay within Whitefish Lake located in the Town of Sand Lake, Sawyer County, Wisconsin, Section Thirteen (13), Township Thirty-nine (39) North, Range Nine (9) West, at any time.

Section VI. Posting Requirements

The Town of Sand Lake shall place and maintain a copy of this Section at all public access points within the jurisdiction of the Town of Sand Lake, Sawyer County N S 5.15 Wis. Admin Code.

Section VII . Penalties

Wisconsin state boating penalties as found in §30.80, Wis. Stats., are adopted by reference.

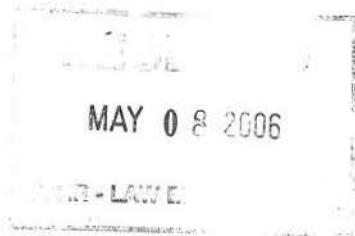
Section VIII. Severability

The provision of this ordinance shall be deemed severable and it is expressly declared that the Town Board would have passed the other provision of this ordinance irrespective of whether or not one or more provisions may be declared invalid. If any provisions of this ordinance or the application to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the remainder of the ordinance and the application of such provisions to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected.

Section IX. Effective Date

This section will become effective upon passage and the day after publication.
