

ORDINANCE 9801 (A)

NO-WAKE RESTRICTION ON WEST FORK OF THE CHIPPEWA ENTERING MOOSE LAKE

A Sole Ordinance to Regulate Boating Upon the Water of the West Fork of the Chippewa River as it enters Moose Lake and Prescribing Penalties for Violation Thereof

The Board of Supervisors of the Town of Round Lake does ordain as follows:

Section I. Applicability and Enforcement

- a.) The provision of this ordinance shall apply to the waters of the West Fork Of the Chippewa River as they enter Moose Lake.
- b ) This chapter shall be enforced by the Sawyer County Sheriff or any officer of the Town of the Round Lake appointed by the Board of Supervisors of the Town of Round Lake.

Section II. Intent

The intent of this ordinance is to provide safe and healthful conditions for the enjoyment of aquatic recreation consistent with public rights and interest, and the capability of the water resources.

Section III. State Boating and Safety Laws Adopted

State boating laws as found in ss. 30.50 to 30.71, Wis. Stats., are adopted by reference.

Section IV. Definitions

"Slow-No-Wake" means that speed at which a boat moves as slowly as possible while still maintaining steerage control.

Section V. Controlled Area

No person shall operate a boat faster than slow-no-wake in the waters of the West Fork of the Chippewa River beginning 500 feet north of the Pine Point Road Bridge and ending 500 feet south of the bridge as the river enters into Moose Lake at any time.

Section VII. Posting Requirements

The Town of Round Lake shall place and maintain a copy of this Ordinance at all public access points within the jurisdiction of the town.

Section VII. Penalties

Wisconsin state boating penalties as found in s.30.80, Wis. Stats., are adopted by reference.

Section VIII. Severability

The provision of this ordinance shall be deemed severable and it is expressly declared that the Board of Wisconsin State boating penalties as found in s.30.80, Wis. Stats., are adopted by reference.

Section VIII. Severability

The provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed severable and it is expressly declared that the Board of Supervisors of the Town of Round Lake would have passed the other provisions of this ordinance irrespective of whether or not one or more provisions may be declared invalid. If any provision of this ordinance or the application to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the remainder of the ordinance and the application of such provisions to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected.

Section IX. Effective Date

This section will become effective upon passage and the day after publication.
