

**Town of Minong 2019 Project  
Grants CBCW 60919 and 61919**

**FINAL REPORT**

In this the seventh year of the town-wide CBCW program, the operation again ran smoothly thanks in large part due to our coordinator, Amy Wandel who was always able to shift inspectors among landings as needed. A total of 17 paid inspectors logged 2,949 hours on the eight landings included in these grants. Overall, 2,698 boats were inspected . Lake –specific data are listed in the enclosed Data Summary.

Eurasian watermilfoil was found on two boats exiting Lake Nancy. Boats were also inspected for zebra mussels; Big McKenzie Lake in nearby Burnett County now has a zebra mussel population. No zebra mussels were found on any boats inspected in 2019.

A primary objective of CBCW is to educate lake users about AIS and their role in prevention of its spread. On this and other counts, the 2019 project was very successful. More than 3,600 folks were educated (or re-educated ) by our inspectors
