

## Yellow Iris Monitoring: Boom Lake

### Purpose:







The Oneida County AIS team went to Boom Lake in Rhinelander, Wisconsin on June 5<sup>th</sup>, 2020 to gather information about the yellow iris population there. Monitoring started at 12:00pm and finished around 3:00pm. The weather was sunny, warm and windy, which created waves as we worked on the shores. Oneida County staff walked along the shoreline near the public boat landing searching for any yellow iris plants. We found approximately ten plants growing along the shoreline, and we dug up as many as we could. There were a few plants that we were unable to remove completely, so when this was the case, we clipped the flowers on them to prevent the seeds from spreading. All plant parts were put in heavy duty garbage bags and disposed of properly.
