AIS programs, projects, events, and coordination:

- o AIS signage
 - AIS sign inspections were conducted in Buffalo and Trempealeau Counties in December 2019, and all information was updated in SWIMS. During the inspections, some problematic signage was noted that should be addressed once the ground thaws in spring. New locations where "Stop Aquatic Hitchhiker" signage would be beneficial were also identified.
- o Clean Boats Clean Waters
 - Many potential watershed groups in the three counties have been contacted for possible summer volunteer recruitment. Attempts to reach out to new volunteer groups are ongoing, and efforts will be made to include more landings in Buffalo and Trempealeau Counties in 2020, as these areas have had little coverage in previous years.
- o AIS intern

An internship announcement detailing the job responsibilities and intern expectations was posted in various outlets, including UW-La Crosse, Viterbo University, the Lakes and Rivers listserv, AIS listserv, La Crosse Area AIS partnership email list, Handshake system (reaching all UW and Wisconsin-based college campuses), River Alliance social media, the Nelson Institute job board, and Essa. Interviewees will be chosen in March 2020.

o Drain Campaign

 Order information from previous years was compiled. Based on that estimate, an order was placed with Jeanne Scherer for 125 ice packs that will be distributed during the 2020 campaign (June 5-7, 2020).

Tournament angler AIS outreach

Bowfishing tournament angler outreach was identified by the La Crosse Area AIS Partnership as a major need at the January meeting. The Wisconsin Bowfishing Association was contacted for potential tournament outreach in summer 2020. Contact was also made with the UW-La Crosse Fishing Team to discuss the possibility of conducting outreach at their events. The major tournaments that will be held in La Crosse and the surrounding areas in 2020 were determined, and the contact information of the relevant parties was compiled. Efforts to reach out to tournament leaders are ongoing.

o Youth Outdoor Fest

The coordinator for the event, Gretchen Newberry, was contacted regarding participation by the La Crosse Area AIS Partnership in 2020.
