


FLOW AIS Update  
For Oconto County Since 5/25/2022



- FLOW AIS held a Clean Boats Clean Waters training for the Inland Lakes District on 5/26/2022. Nine inspectors were in attendance
- FLOW AIS participated in the training of the Marinette and Oconto County Frogbit Technicians. The Frogbit Tecs completed a Clean Boats Clean Waters training at North Bay Shore Park in Oconto on June 8<sup>th</sup> to help supplement their ongoing frogbit work.
- FLOW AIS met with Rick Mand of Ranch Lake to discuss the purple loosestrife population on the shore of the Lake. A presentation and removal demonstration will be given at the Ranch Lake meeting next month.
- FLOW AIS met with Bob Wittmann of White potato Lake to see the extent of their purple loosestrife population. Spots have been determined of where Biocontrol plants can be placed.
- Citizens Lake Monitoring Quality Assurance supplies was delivered this month to Bass Lake, Chute Pond, Archibald Lake, and Munger Lake.
- Boat landing signage inspections have been done throughout other field work events. Signs have been replaced at Maiden Lake, Surprise Lake, Munger Lake
- Berry Lake used one of FLOW's D.O. meters for their Citizen Lake Monitoring Network testing. The lake has expressed interest in getting their own meter for the lake to use.
